FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

This week we have a little joy as we look ahead a little bit more to the coming Christmas celebration. Let's remember to keep focused on celebrating the birth of Jesus, and also spending this remaining time preparing and opening ourselves to receive Jesus in some new way this year. As a parish we are also preparing for a depth of union as a community that is possible only by the power of Jesus Christ.

The school board met this week. We explored our financial aid structure and looked at ways that this can be made more equitable and address families needs in the most fair and just ways. We also discussed reviewing the Strategic Plan to put it in place, and ways to market the school to engage new families and invite them into our school and parish community.

Pastoral council met and considered the ongoing development of the parish Mission Statement. We also Began to explore how we may refurbish our two current worship sites with elements from the sites that are no longer open. This was felt to be a way to move forward as a combined community and represent the reality of Annunciation Parish as a parish which has personal connection to the four

historical parishes from which it was formed. We also discussed the development of consistent "Annunciation Parish" signs that can be set up at our campuses to reflect our unity as a single Catholic Parish in Gardner. Members of the Pastoral council are available for your feedback into this process. The contact information of the members of parish council can be found on the website (just look under "Contact us" under the "About" tab), you may also call the office to get this information. As always you may contact me and I would be glad to sit with you to discuss your ideas and/or concerns.

We will soon be adding special pages on the website under "Ministries" for each parish ministry with information, summaries of the activities of this ministry, and contact information for the coordinators of these ministries. This will also be made available to all in print form for your convenience. Once our new Business Manager has gotten established, I will be working with him, and the Finance and Pastoral councils on office restructuring that will allow for better coordination between parishioners, departments, and the various ministries. Several have contacted me regarding participating in the ministries we are building and others in enhancing the social and prayer life of the parish. All of this is a sign of the action of the Holy Spirit. The more we walk with the Lord in prayer, fellowship, study, and generosity with our resources, the more our lives are enhanced, and the more we bring God's kingdom of peace on earth.

QUENCH

Every other week we have been featuring an article written by a fellow parishioner sharing some of the ways that they are quenching their thirst for God through various devotions, books and other media. This week's article comes from Phyllis Riley.

I have been asked why, at this time in my life I decided to become a catholic. The truth is that I had been on a pathway which was surely heading in this direction for over 30 years. When the statement, "the fullness of the faith is in the Catholic Church' became truth to me, I believed that this wads the path to the streams of water and perhaps in this place my thirst would be quenched. I have not been disappointed. A door has opened to what seems like a vast new universe of knowledge and possibility; it is as though God has said, come on in and don't be afraid, there is no place you can go where I won't be. In the church I have discovered that when we partake of the Eucharist we may even catch a glimpse of heaven.

I am fortunate to have had catholic family, friends and work related associates who have been instrumental in planting seeds of change. My former church friends are dear, and dedicated, and caring, and I wish I could bring them along with me, but those aren't my decisions to make. I only know I need to keep moving.

There have been a few programs on EWTN Channel 56. which have really supported my ongoing quest for direction. For example I was elated to find The Journey Home with Marcus Grodi. I'll bet I've watched this program faithfully once a week for about 8 years. I still love watching it even after joining the church. This program offers the stories of converts to the Catholic faith. It is fascinating to see how the Holy Spirit works so personally in each guest's life to bring about the changes of heart and mind that lead them into the church. Their stories lead me to reflect on similar experiences in my own

This and other programs continue to inform and remind me of the richness of the faith. There is so much to learn and these programs truly help to guench my desire for closeness to God; though truly, I think nothing ever does completely and that's a very good thing.

ADULT CONFIRMATION

There can be many reasons why someone isn't confirmed at a younger age, but no reason why we can't receive as adults when we feel called by the Holy Spirit to receive the sacrament. Each year our diocese holds a confirmation celebration specifically for adults (18+) in February for those who have come to a point in their lives where they wish to complete their initiation into the church through this sacrament. For most who went through faith formation (CCD or Catholic School) when they were younger the preparation process is fairly simple.
