From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate Trinity Sunday. God is a miraculous being who gives life to all things, who leads us to perfect fulfillment, and who exists as a unity of three divine persons in the one true God. In a past Sunday we heard Jesus express his desire that we all would be one as God is one - joined by bonds of love so strong that three are united as one. Jesus wishes us to increase the bonds of love between us, and to work together (despite our failings and those of others) loving each other with God as a model of unity and love. As we do this, we become more like God - and we join together as one Body of Christ.

This past week the Finance Council met and reviewed our current status, discussed the upcoming business plans/property sales/contracts, and approved financial transactions. We are in a good clarity with regards our financial position, and we discussed giving a more comprehensive report to the parish. This report, far from just being a list of numbers, will give you a picture of the current status of the parish's finances and a look forward to the future. We are truly blessed to have such dedicated individuals helping to guide our financial health.

Thanks to all who continue to contact us with your feedback regarding the incorporation of elements from our historical parish buildings into our current facilities. Please continue to give feedback to myself or a member of the Pastoral Council on these proposals I placed in the column last week: (1) To install the Stations of the Cross from Sacred Heart in Holy Spirit, (2) To install the sanctuary lamp from St. Joseph in Holy Rosary, (3) To Install the Baptismal font from Sacred Heart in Holy Rosary, (4) To replace the current statue of St. Joseph in Holy Spirit with the one from St. Joseph. As these sales move closer, I offer again to speak with anyone who would like share their feelings on this process or any other lingering merger issues.

One of the ways we fulfill our mission to spread the Gospel is to operate our school. Please invite parents you know who may be looking for a change of school placement to come and visit. We have opened new avenues of financial aid, and will be bringing in additional academic and social/emotional resources to help us to take care of the needs of a wide variety of students. With our new principal at the helm, we will continue to build an environment that has the ability to treat children not as numbers but as individuals, a place for students to be well prepared for their next educational endeavor, and a place that the truths of God can be honored and linked in with academics to provide children a truly Christian worldview.

On the upcoming Memorial Day holiday (as we celebrate in many ways) let us remember and pray for those in our armed services who sacrificed so much for us. Let their example be an inspiration to us as we move courageously forward as a community in the love and unity of the Lord. As we join in with Jesus in His sacrifice we will experience the victory He has won.

This Monday, May 28th, is Memorial Day. Memorial Day is observed on the last Monday in May. It is a day on which we all take time to remember those who have died in active military service.

To honor our fallen heroes, the daily Mass on Monday May 28th at 9:00a.m. will be held in Notre Dame Cemetery. If it rains, the Mass will be held at Holy Rosary Church instead of the cemetery.

Is God calling you to life in Christ through the Catholic Church?

RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is a process for those over the age of 7 who wish to be initiated into the Catholic church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. It is also for those who have been baptized in other Christian traditions who wish to join in full communion with the Catholic Church. For most people the process takes about a year and includes reflecting on Gospels so you can grow in relationship with Jesus Christ, learning about the basic teachings of the church and answering your questions about God and the church. In addition to a process for adults we offer groups for families with children, and teens. —Pope Francis, Message for the 52nd World Communications Day

May 24, 2018

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In his message this year for World Communications Day, Pope Francis contrasts the constructive power of authentic communications and the destructive nature of fake news in our world. He writes, "a weighty responsibility rests on the shoulders of those whose job is to provide information, namely journalists, the protectors of news. In today's world . . . it is a mission . . . it means being in touch with people's lives. . . a real means of promoting goodness, generating trust, and opening the way to communion and peace."

On the weekend of June 3rd, our Diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). This national collection helps bring the Gospel message to the public square so that all can know the love of God and help make this a better world. It is not a mere coincidence that the pope's citation from the Gospel of St. John has also been part of the masthead of our own newspaper, The Catholic Free Press, for the past 67 years and now, by extension, the vision of our diocesan-wide Communications Ministry. Faithful and honest sharing about the life of our Catholic Community is at the service of our evangelizing mission, which seeks to proclaim God's love to the world as the true path to eternal happiness.

As people continue to access more information on mobile devices and feel overwhelmed by so much noise, there is an increased need to provide faith resources on these platforms as well. With your support of the CCC, the daily readings and seasonal reflections are available as free podcasts to download and listen to at any time, or to read from our diocesan and parish websites along with watching local Masses and program, as well as reading local and national Catholic news stories. Thanks to your donations, Catholics are able to stay connected to their parish and to their Catholic faith even when they are traveling or not regularly at Mass.

Roughly half of the funds collected will remain here in the Diocese to help our local communications projects expand parish-centered communications in collaboration with diocesan programs. The remainder funds national media relations and communications efforts as well as international projects in developing countries. For more information about the collection and the projects it supports, visit www.usccb.org/ccf.

We must rely on your financial support of this collection in order to truly heed the words of Pope Francis, "As sons and daughters of God, we are called to communicate with everyone, without exception." Please accept my thanks for reflecting on how you can help.

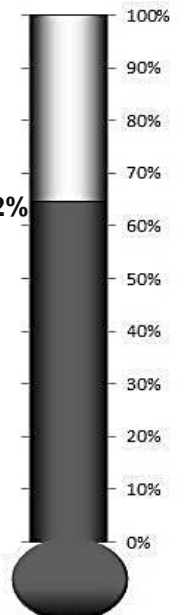
