

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we hear about the Pharisee and the Publican. A parable about humility and realizing our real status in life. Humility is not about thinking poorly of yourself, it is about knowing the truth about yourself. The Publican knew his position with respect to God, he knew that he (and all of us) are unworthy of the great attention and love that God shows us. He realizes that his sins (and we all sin) have caused a rift in his relationship with God. He simply pleads with God—not making excuses—asking for God to forgive him. The Pharisee is too busy praising himself and looking down on others to even be aware of his sins (or even aware of the separation in his relationship to God). God does not want us to be hopelessly crushed by the reality of our sin, but simply to be honest about it and to turn to him rather than make excuses or focus on the faults of others. This is hard for all of us (present company included), but working on his brings a treasure of the humility that help to reconcile us to God.

Our Bazaar was a success! Special thanks to all who participated: all those who helped making meat pies, or Polish specialties, the crew in the Poutine Factory, the cooks in the kitchen that kept mountains of food coming, those who assisted with running booths, and all the set—up and take-down done by staff and volunteers. Also thanks to all who came and participated in this event not just to raise money, but also to come together as a parish. We continue to work on creating more unity in Gardner—thanks to all who came in a spirit of that unity.

The Men's Group seems to be starting to gel. Men are stepping forward into leadership and we had a wonderful discussion this past week. I see great possibilities for this group to continue to be a place where men can discuss their faith and join in service to the Church and community together. The next meeting is on November 18th. There is a Flocknote group for the Men's Group that men may join to receive updates and meeting reminders.

I'm please to announce that the bidding for the convent renovation has been completed and contractor has been selected. I am please with the cost—which is reasonable—and also with the individual who will be leading the project. We have also had two contractors do walk-throughs regarding the handicap access project. I'd like to get whatever portion of that work started that we can. I will keep you posted.

Many of you have noticed that Deacon Mick has not been around lately. He is currently on a leave of absence and will not be participating in ministry at this time. I have met with him recently and we are going to be doing so regularly. I look forward to have more information to share with all of you as it becomes available. Thank you for your concern. I will communicate to him that his absence is noticed.

Finance Council meets this coming Monday and we will be reviewing and approving the final reports for last fiscal year. The hope is to also have the draft of the report to parishioners to be reviewed by the council as well—we will be including this in the bulletin and on the website once completed as usual.

The best parking is on 2 side streets: Dewey St. and Mason St., across from Planned Parenthood.




