

From the Pastor's Desk

This week we concluded the celebration of the Easter "Octave." The Church has long felt that the joy of Easter is too much to only keep in a 24 hour period, so we stretch out the celebration for a week. It concludes with Divine Mercy Sunday. We did have the Divine Mercy devotions (Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction, and singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet) - you can still access the recording of this on the website to pray along (there is a link on the main page, and it is in the "Virtual Prayer" section). I invite you to take some time with your spouse, family, or friend to watch and pray these together. Also setting aside the time that you would go to Mass and watching electronically is also a good way to stay connected for the day when we can celebrate together again.

We continue to try to stay connected. Regular postings of the Mass are put up on the Website and Facebook. We have timed the recording to have the 4:00 Mass on line by 4:00pm so that you can keep as close to your routine as possible. We have also been recording the 10:30, but have to do the recording at 10:30 in order to be able to align with the radio - so it is up a little later. Two daily Masses a week are also posted for you to have a briefer and perhaps more intimate experience of the Mass. There were also suggestions that we try to have a Drive-In Mass. Although the Bishop has not yet approved these, I have an FM Transmitter arriving Friday (used my own money) so that if we get the OK you can join an outdoor Mass in your car and tune the radio to hear the audio. We plan to resume Drive-In confessions this Saturday. Please let me know if you have any other suggestions.

I promised an update on our financial situation in this letter. We now have the numbers in from Easter. As it stands now collections are down \$13,842 from where were last year that this same time. In the 6 months prior to the shutdown we took in an average of \$9,500 per week. That average is now down to \$7,700. This loss of \$1,800 per week in regular income is responsible for much of this shortfall. This shortfall will only continue to grow in the future, at this rate. I appreciate all those who have made the effort to continue to donate, and especially those who have contributed a bit more to help with the shortfall. I was talking to a friend, who truly sees the value not only in supporting the church and its mission, but also of the spiritual value of the sacrifice required. She admitted that with the change of routine, she had just gotten out of her usual routine and missed donating. She said to me in a call last night that she sent in her contribution. I suspect there are others who have been disrupted by these times. A reminder that collections can be mailed, slipped in the mail slot at the rectory, or you can sign up (and many have) for the electronic giving option on the website.

Enough of that - as many of you know, I don't like to have to speak about money but you deserve to know where we stand. I am praying that our spirit of connection stands firm, and that our spirit of stewardship increases and when we come back together we can be even stronger than before in many ways. Let me know what we can do to help to keep people involved - some suggestions that have been given are in the works (like the Drive-in Masses), and others are being looked at in planning meetings. May God continue to bless us and to give us protection and support. May we also bring a bit of the peace of heaven to this earth by the strength of our community.
