

### From the Pastor's Desk

Sometimes we can be slow to advance in the spiritual life because we fear to let go of things. We all know that there are habits that we should let go of, maybe relationships that are toxic or unhealthy, attachments to things and to places that stop us from moving forward. Jesus calls us to be able to let these things go, when necessary, and to trust that by following Him we will be provided for. I have had to let go of plans, places, careers, homes, and relationships on my journey. When we get to the point of letting go, we sometimes think that we can never be complete without these things that have become so much a part of our lives - but this is not so. I can attest that the Lord provides what will fill us even when these are let go. Jesus says that those who give up for the kingdom Jesus said, "Truly I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or farms, for My sake and for the gospel's sake, but that he will receive a hundred times as much now in the present age, houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and farms, along with persecutions; and in the age to come, eternal life." Our lenten practices train us to let go of some small things so that we can be prepared to let go of what gets in the way of our progress to God in Jesus Christ.

We had a lively Pastoral Council meeting last week and introduced a few new members. Members will be sending in pictures to be placed on the website so that you can see who they all are and be able to approach them with concerns or questions to be brought to Council meetings. Things had gotten a bit scattered with the Council due to COVID, but I am very encouraged that we are back on track. Finance Council meets this Monday and will examine such issues as the wind damage that occurred to a garage roof on Nichols Street, the engineering study done on the tower of Holy Rosary, and the future of our building on Central Street. We will also be considering some potential new members to the Council. Many thanks to the parishioners on both of these Councils for their advice and for their dedication to the parish.

On the 25th we will be celebrating the feast of the Annunciation with a special Mass in the evening with the Bishop as principal celebrant. We had other plans for more social activities - like the speed painting of Rob Surette that we had a couple years back. Once COVID is done, we will put more energy into these sorts of events. We are considering how to safely do a parish picnic, and are looking for more and more things opening up. Stay tuned.

God is good to us, and we need to be open to all God wishes to give to us. If we can empty ourselves of the things that block us up, we can receive more of these blessings. I look forward to us as a community becoming a more powerful force for the good the Lord wishes to work in this community. I also look forward to the increasing devotion to the Lord that will result from turning energy given to divisions to acts of love and unity, and the increased presence of God's power that we will see as we deepen our faith life. That is a community that people will want to be a part of, and one that we all can be proud of.

- May 31st Drawing of cash raffle



## \*Safety Guidelines for Masses

Out of charity for others please observe the following safety guidelines when attending Mass.

- Wear a facemask at all times during Mass except when receiving communion. We have extras if you need one.
- Please use hand sanitizer upon entering the church. It is also available at the communion stations.
- Worship aids are being used instead of missalettes at this time. At the end of Mass please discard them in the trash cans provided at the back of church.
- Always maintain a social distance of 6 feet from those who do not live in your household. This includes in the communion line and when leaving church. The blue tape on the floor will help to guide you.
- Do not sit closer than 6 feet to those who do not live in your household.
- If the church has reached its capacity with social distanced seating, you may go down to the church hall to watch the Mass live with a video and sound feed. Communion will be brought downstairs to those who are seated there.
- Instructions on receiving communion will be given at Mass.
- Donations may be left in the baskets by the doors.
- Singing by the congregation is temporarily limited to help reduce the spreading of virus carrying aerosolized droplets.

You may also find it comforting to know that:

- Doors and windows are being left open to increase ventilation
- Some seats have been blocked off to help us properly social distance
- Our priests and Eucharistic Ministers will set down the Ciborium holding the Eucharist and sanitize, if they think they may have touched someone before continuing to distribute communion.
- Volunteers sanitize the church after each Mass.
- Ushers are available to help you if you have any questions.

## Annunciation Novena

Join us daily from March 16 – March 24<sup>th</sup> in praying the Angelus as an Annunciation Novena. While traditionally prayed at 6AM, noon and 6 PM, this simple prayer may be prayed at any time of day and still be efficacious. It will be prayed at the end of Mass each day of the Novena but you may certainly pray it from home as well.
