

### From the Pastor's Desk

Today we remember the day of Pentecost. The day that Jesus' promise to send the Holy Spirit was fulfilled. The condition of the disciples before the Spirit came and their condition after the Spirit came is telling. Like us, without the presence of the Holy Spirit we can be locked in a room of fear - afraid as they were to engage the world and spread the Gospel. Like them we can be unsure of God's working in our life, we can be troubled by all the things in the world. With the presence of the Spirit things are different. Fear changes to confidence, doubt becomes hope, and we can see more clearly how to cooperate with the action of God in the world so that we don't need to be so troubled by the world's various pressures and problems. Jesus does not leave us alone; the Spirit is there for the asking.

Last week I met with Bishop McManus regarding our renovation of the former Reagan Street convent into a Parish Center. He is behind us in our plans to further be able to bring life and ministry engagement to the parish. Also, he is supportive of the Counseling Center that we as a parish are looking to start. Such a chance to provide for the needs of our community, to give options for faith-based counseling to those who are seeking it, and the possibilities of meeting other needs as disciples of Jesus Christ is exciting. I was on the phone with contractors and getting things prepared for the final permitting with the city. Having flexible space for religious education, faith formation, and working space for other meetings, gatherings, and ministries will open many possibilities for us and for those who will follow us.

We finished our round of receptions for the Legacy of Hope Capitol campaign. Materials will be provided in the bulletin and website to further explain this campaign going forward. As we begin to see the returns from the campaign you will see some other long-awaited projects being accomplished. This campaign comes at a good time for us as we do our part (like past generations did) to insure the future life of the parish. Please join me in participating. If people would like to have another reception or two let me know and we can set it up.

Pastoral Council met this past week. We reviewed progress on our renovation projects and updated and discussed our ministries that will be coming back online (Youth, Hospital, Prison, Nursing Home, Homebound). Thanks to those who have stepped forward to take a leadership role in some of these. You can always get your name in to be part of the post COVID ministries. We also explored suggestions regarding music at Mass and discussed the loosening of restrictions that will start next month.

We hosted the regional confirmation this past Friday. Once again Fr. Miguel, Gustavo, and I were able to have dinner with the Bishop and priests from surrounding parishes before the Mass. We also had our First Communion Mass on Saturday where many of our young people received the Lord in the Eucharist for the first time. Please pray for them and for those confirmed that they take an active role in their faith and in the life of the Church. It is a breath of hope that we can do these things again and to have less worry and anxiety as we engage in the important work of bringing others to a deeper life with Christ.

Enjoy the warmer weather and the increased ability to meet with family and friends. May God Bless you all.

As a parish our <u>target is</u> to raise \$593,768, with 40% of all monies raised to remain here.


This means that <u>our parish</u> <u>has the potential to raise</u> <u>\$237.507</u>. If we exceed our target then 60% over our target will remain here.

Throughout the pandemic our Ushers and Cleaners have GREETERS MINISTRY heroically given of their time to help create a safe environment for those who have been able to the ment for those who have been able to join us for Mass. They have served a wonderful ministry of welcome, making us feel safe to worship together.

As Covid winds down (hopefully in the next few months) and the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass comes to an end (on Pentecost 5/23), we would like to see an extension and transformation of our Usher Ministry into a Greeting Ministry. What would the difference be? In addition to welcoming people our ushers have been responsible for things like insuring that we did not have overcrowding, that people were wearing masks etc.

The focus for Greeters, may, for a time, have to include helping people find a seat that is safely distanced from their neighbor, but they would primarily be focused on making sure that people feel welcome as they enter or leave our parish. They may also be called upon to serve as a resource to answer people's basic questions, such as where is the restroom / changing table, and be able to direct people to resources, such as the bulletin or registration forms.

There is no age limit to this ministry. Those who are single, couples or families are all welcome to get involved. It would be great if the faces we see as greeters represent the diversity of our parish community. We will plan to do a quick basic training for new volunteers on several dates at the end of May and beginning of June.
