

From the Pastor's Desk

Jesus says to a deaf man as he heals him: "Ephphatha!", that is, "Be opened!" He calls all of us to be open to His word. There is a tremendous wisdom in what Jesus says to us, and a great truth about the reality of God and our place in the universe. Be open to His words of challenge - don't close your ears because it is hard to hear. Be open to hearing the truths He speaks. Be open to following as His disciple and learning from the Master. Be open to the needs of those around you and care for them in their need. This openness is so wonderful because as we become more open, we widen a channel for God to come to us. The peace and faith in the Lord that comes has been a great consolation to me in many difficult times. Be open to what He says and thus be open to what He gives.

Finance Council met last week, and we approved the budget for next fiscal year. Due to careful management of our funds, and your continued generosity we hope to look forward to a stable year to come. We will not turn attention to tying up last fiscal year and preparing the summary report that will be given to all of you so you can see how we fared during this strange year. I am encouraged by the confidence that you have all shown as we have solidified some stability and as we embark on renovation. My goal is to make even stronger our financial stability, increase our ministerial effectiveness as a church doing Christ's work, and leaving to the next generation an infrastructure to continue that work and worship. With your continued help I am quite confident we will make the final steps to arrive there.

School started this Monday. It was great to see all the kids and families. We have our new principal in place, and he is very eager and energetic. I stopped in at the beginning of the year faculty meeting last week and was encouraged by the positive attitudes, the camaraderie, and the desire to continue to build our school to its potential. Please continue to pray for the children and their families as they embark on learning that involves body, mind, and spirit.

On a personal note, I went to Portland Maine on Thursday of last week to preside at a renewal of vows for my sister's in-laws. They have been married for 60 years and are still going strong. It is a great testament to the wonderful fruits and rewards of perseverance. During the ceremony they each said a few words to each other. One line stuck out to me: "I love you now more than I did when I married you." The great joy in a Spirit-filled union can be is touching to behold. The more we are open to Jesus and what He teaches about many things, the more we align ourselves to the great power and Spirit of God which can make miraculous things happen.



- 5%: drainage issues at Holy Spirit Hall



A long-held need for handicap accessibility will be completed with a portion of the funds generated.


Cemetery Roads and Maintenance
