From the Pastor's Desk

Jesus tells His disciples things that they don't want to hear. He tells them that He must die, that all their big plans to be "big shots" in the local politics are not going to pan out. We all can set up expectations for our lives, we all can figure out the way things are "supposed to go" to feel like life was successful. But these are not always true. There are many people who set definitions of success, many who may look oddly at a person's life journey because it does not seem to fit in with the way we look at as successful in the world. However, look at these guys. It is considered a success for your organization to hit the Fortune 500, for you to be showered with gifts and praise, for you to be famous and be called upon by others. The Apostles, however, saw Jesus die, and despite all their work and effort see their fledgling organization (our Church) ready to collapse under persecution - and they all get martyred or exiled themselves. Not a Hollywood ending for a success. BUT that was not the end. The continued presence of the Spirit has allowed the Church to be here 2000 years later (when all other "organizations" of that time are gone). The executed Apostles are still talked about (and "famous"), and the death of that leader opened a super nature passageway to an eternal life. What does not count as success in the world's eyes at a given time may in fact turn out to be a smashing success when God gets involved.

We had our Pastoral Council meeting and were able to discuss some priorities that the members saw the Lord calling us to, it was a good process and I have been looking at the list. Some of the things we have spoken about before, but now the Council has placed them back on the front screen of my radar. We have obtained the building permit for the Parish Center (former Regan St. Convent) renovation, work should begin soon. I have been in discussion regarding an offer we have been given for our property at 100 Central Street (former Caring Place) please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns. Things are progressing on the opening of the Health Center; the Director who has been appointed is our parishioner, Angela Hakkila. Angela has great experience in mental health and is eager to work on the project. We have had several conversations about this project and look forward to our parish being a more significant part of improving the lives of the people in our local community. Rectory painting preparations are progressing, and I am awaiting more information from the architect for the handicapped access. I called this week to finalize the parish signs project and hope to see that progressing soon.

We had our parish picnic this past Sunday and it was a great success. Well attended, overflowing with good will and positive energy, and blessed with great weather - it was wonderful. Thanks again to all those who put such hard work into making it so successful. These individuals are a testament to the gifts that reside in our community - I am so grateful to those who use these gifts to make things like this possible.

Those who were at the picnic or Mass that morning will note that I was feeling a little "under the weather." I assumed it was just a common cold and being tired due to some of the extra things that needed to be done for the day. Nonetheless I took some extra precautions because I was feeling ill - like masking, keeping a bit more distance, not eating with anyone. When I wasn't better by the next day I went to get tested. It turns out I was positive for COVID. Since I have been vaccinated, it likely kept my infection from being severe. I called the Board of Health and reviewed all my activities of the days preceding the test. The initial assessment is that the transmission risk was low - if this assessment changes you will be kept informed by general announcements and phone call if necessary. You will not see me this weekend since I am quarantined till Thursday - I will be praying for all of you.

There is always a combination of things that happen together - let us not let the worry disrupt the positive effects of the good. We have come a long way as a community over the last few years, and more wonderful things are to come. Please join me in praying for safety, security, peace, and health for us all - May the Lord be with us in all things.

The Abandonment of Hippocratic Medicine




Our Parish's Progress To Date!


