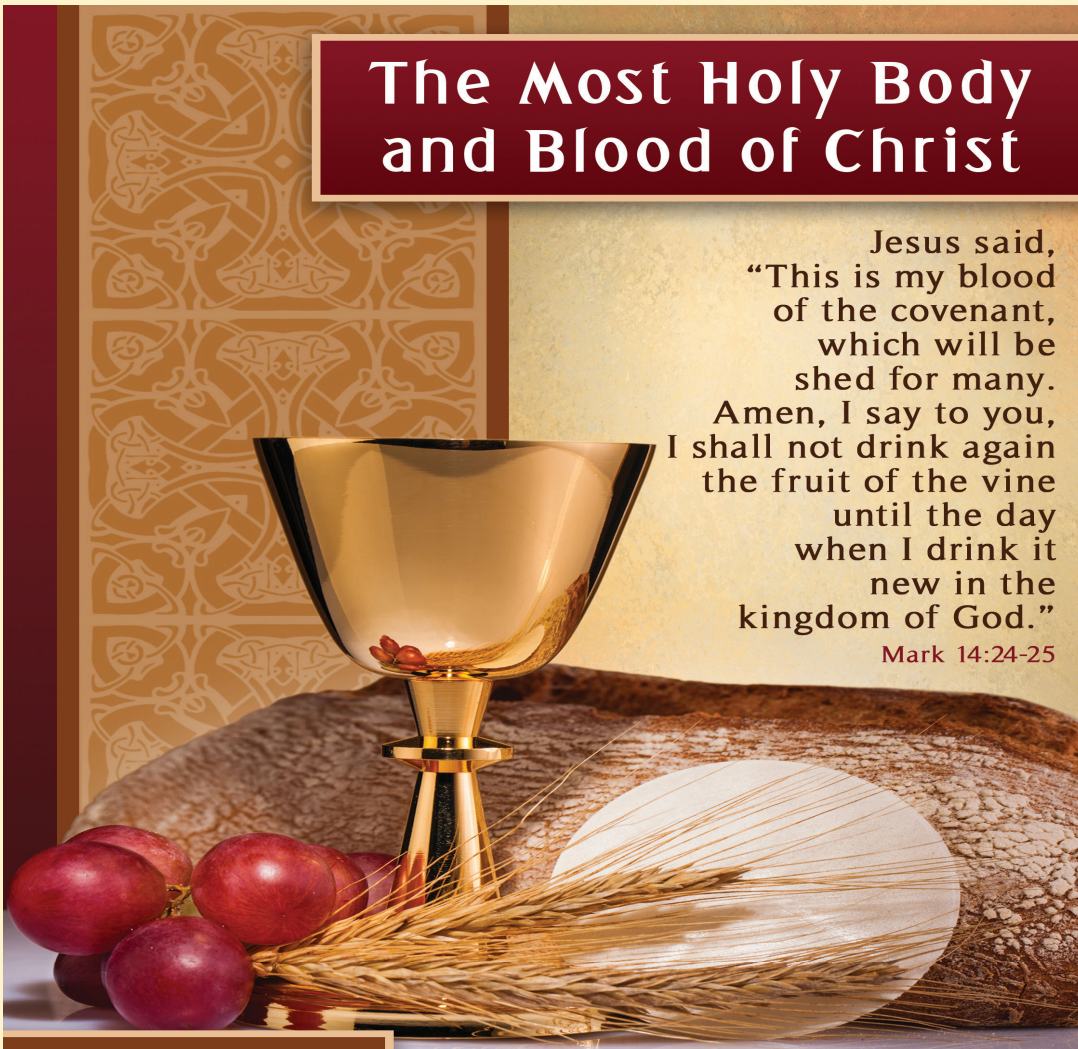

**“How shall I make a return to the Lord
for all the good he has done for me?
The cup of salvation I will take up,
and I will call upon the name of the Lord.”
Psalm 116:12-13**

As we commemorate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ this Sunday, we realize how blessed we are. Throughout the sojourn of the Hebrews in the desert when they were at their lowest points, God nourished them with water at the rock of Meribah and with manna in the morning dew. The second reading from Hebrews 9:11-15 reminds us that there is no more need for sacrifices of goats or bulls or heifers since “the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, [to] cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God.” In other words, Christ’s sacrificial giving of himself eliminated the need for any other sacrifice. Today’s feast recalls the great gift of love Jesus gave for us in laying down his life for us, whom he calls “friends”, and in giving us a permanent memorial of his real presence in the gift of the Eucharist.

Psalm 116 is a psalm of thanksgiving; the word “Eucharist” in Greek means to give thanks. At every celebration of the Mass, we should give thanks for the sacrificial love of Jesus for us. We should give thanks that at the Last Supper he left us the precious gift of his body and blood and called us to install this as a memorial so that we may proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes. This is precisely why we have the Mass; it is Jesus’ will that we gather in community to worship and receive his presence in the Eucharist. Have we been faithful in this regard?

How do we make a return to the Lord for his great goodness to us? First and foremost, by participating in the Mass and making the preparations necessary to receive him in this most holy sacrament. Another way is for us to spend this coming week thinking of something or someone for which or whom we are grateful. Let us join the psalmist in giving thanks for all of God’s blessings and most especially for the gift of his presence that nourishes our unseen souls with Christ’s mystical food from heaven.

EAST OF FAITH

The Corpus Christi Procession

In the thirteenth century, a Belgian nun by the name of Juliana had a vision: she saw the full moon silvery and radiant except for one dark spot. The meaning of the vision was revealed to her: the moon was the Church's liturgical year, the dark spot a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Today's feast of Corpus Christi—the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—grew from Juliana's vision. On this feast, many parishes observe the traditional Corpus Christi procession, giving honor to the Eucharist by carrying this greatest treasure out of the safety of our churches and into our streets. At the end of every Mass we are not just let out, we are sent forth, strengthened by the Eucharist, to be the Body of Christ in the world. The Corpus Christi procession is the dismissal writ large! We take Jesus with us, not only in our hearts, but carried in our midst and exposed in a monstrance. It is a public profession of faith and a blessing of the world. Jesus walks with us on these streets that we walk day after day, among those who know him but yearn to know him better, and among those who do not know him. The Eucharist is a mystery to be believed, to be celebrated—and to be lived.

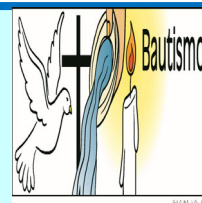

MASS PROTOCOLS

For those who may not have heard, we are no longer requiring social distancing at our Masses. Also, those who have been fully vaccinated are not required to wear masks; those who have not been fully vaccinated are still required to do so. 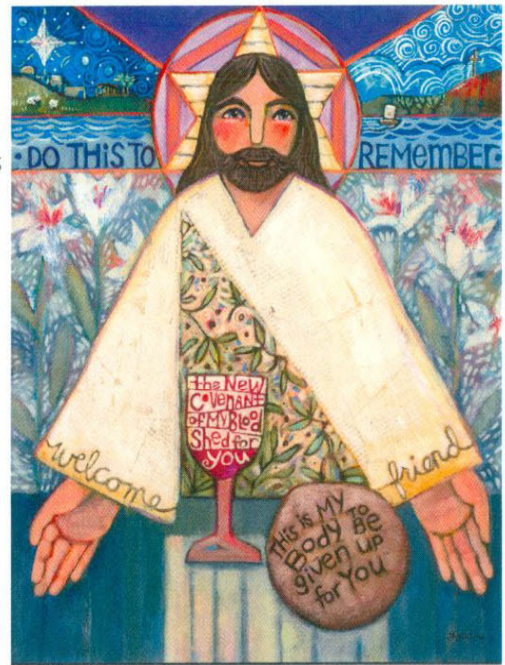

St. Matthew's Kids

In the beginning of today's Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples to prepare for the Passover meal. Like most meals, the Passover meal required planning and preparation. Our celebration of the Sunday Eucharist also requires planning and preparation. Certainly, the ministers at the Eucharist prepare for their roles: the priest prays and prepares the homily; the prayers of petition are written; the music ministers prayerfully select music and practice it before Mass; Eucharistic ministers, lectors and altar servers prepare carefully for their roles. As the worshipping assembly, we can also prepare for the Mass through our prayer during the week, by reading the Scripture before Mass, and by making ourselves present to the Eucharistic celebration.

As you gather as a family, talk about some of the things that are required to prepare for your family meals. Plan together a special Sunday meal by choosing the menu, preparing the shopping list, and assigning duties for cooking, setting the table, preparing decorations, leading the prayers, and cleaning. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 14:12-16, 22-26. Notice how Jesus instructed his disciples to prepare for their Passover meal. All meals require planning and preparation; so, too, our Sunday Eucharist requires planning. What might we do as a family to better prepare for our celebration of the Eucharist? Choose one or more ideas you can do as a family. Pray together that God will help your family make your celebration of the Eucharist the highlight of your week. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

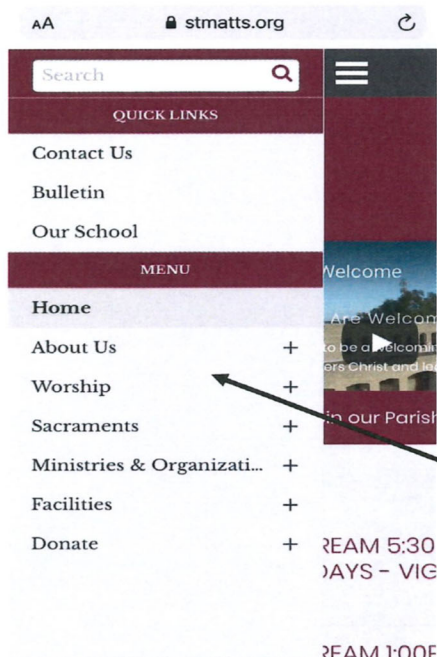

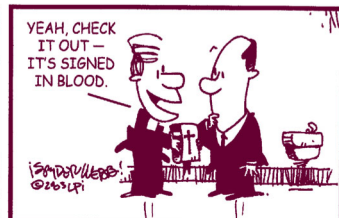

SACRIFICE

Today the Church focuses on the Eucharist. Today's readings remind us how connected to ancient blood sacrifices we are when offering our unbloody sacrifice. The reading from Exodus describes a solemn ritual designed so the Israelites would never forget their covenant with God. The reading from the Letter to the Hebrews turns us from those ancient animal sacrifices, the first efforts to worship the living God. Our sacrifice is the body and blood of the Son of God. Because of Christ we have a new covenant.

The Gospel from Mark retells the establishment of that covenant, the familiar story of the Last Supper. Juxtaposed with the story of animal sacrifice as it is here, we are challenged to listen with new attention, to remember the great price paid for our salvation. Jesus gave his body and every drop of his blood for us.
