



THE OBEDIENCE OF ABRAHAM AND JESUS

God tested Abraham by asking not for an ordinary sacrifice, which would have been a partial burning with the meat divided between God and the people and eaten by those who sacrificed, but for a holocaust, a total burning of the sacrificial animal. This type of sacrifice consecrated the entire offering to God alone. This is what God was asking of Abraham in offering his only son, Isaac. When Abraham demonstrated his obedience, that was enough. This story from today’s scriptures foretells the completion of the blood sacrifices of the old covenant in the new covenant: the blood of God’s own Son, offered to us on the cross and in the Eucharist. Abraham’s obedience foreshadows the obedience of Jesus to God’s promise of salvation. The obedience of Abraham is rewarded in the birth to him, through Isaac, of many nations. From the desk of our pastor, Father Tony Neusch.

“Take your son, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you.” Most of the art we find depicting this scene has Isaac as a young boy, 10 years old or so and it makes this story completely gut wrenching. A father only in his old age receiving the demand to offer the child of God’s promise as a sacrificial burnt offering. The truth of the matter is Isaac is probably much closer to the age of 25. Isaac is a young man, in the prime of his youth. At any step of the way he could have overpowered his elderly father and walked away. But he allowed himself to be led three days into the wilderness. He allowed himself to become a pack animal carrying wood upon his back. He permitted himself to build his own funeral pyre. He submitted and opened not his mouth as his father bound him hand and foot and laid him upon the sacrificial altar. He did not cry out as the knife was raised over the head to be drawn across his neck.

And on this mountain the Lord will provide. The voice of the Lord cried out and stayed the hand of slaughter and the promise was carried into the future generations. Perhaps instead of reflecting on Father Abraham’s faith, we should silently gaze at the profound faith and trust of Isaac the son. The true hero of the story is not the one who would sacrifice his son for the sake of the promise, but the son whose faith was strong enough not to deflect the father’s blade.

Mushroom and Black Bean Tortilla Casserole

PREP: 15 mins. SERVING: 4 TOTAL TIME: 30 mins.

Ingredients:

- 2 teaspoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 3/4 pound cremini or button mushrooms, trimmed and quartered
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- Coarse salt and ground pepper
- 1 can (15.5 ounces) black beans, rinsed and drained
- 8 corn tortillas, warmed and halved
- 2 cups salsa
- 1 1/4 cups shredded Monterey jack cheese (4 ounces)



1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium-high. Add mushrooms and cook, stirring often, until browned, 7 minutes. Add garlic and cayenne; season with salt and pepper. Add black beans and stir to combine. Cook until beans are warmed through, 2 minutes. Remove from heat.
2. Arrange 5 tortilla halves in a 2-quart baking dish. Top with half the bean mixture and 1/2 cup salsa, then sprinkle with one-third the cheese. Repeat with another layer of tortilla halves, bean mixture, salsa, and cheese. Top with remaining tortilla halves, salsa, and cheese.
3. Cover with foil and bake until center is hot and cheese melts, 10 minutes. Uncover and bake until cheese is bubbling, 5 minutes.

BROTHER LOUGHLAN SOFIELD, S.T., a Missionary Servant of the Most Holy Trinity, is currently the director of the community's Senior Ministry house. Brother Sofield has worked in almost 300 dioceses in six continents. He was Senior Editor of *Human Development* magazine for over 30 years. In addition to publishing numerous articles on ministry, he is co-author of several books, including: *Principled Ministry*; *Facing Forgiveness*; *Uniting Our Gifts in Ministry*; *Building Community: Christian, Caring, Vital*; and *Design for Wholeness*, all published by Ave Maria Press.

Brother Sofield has served as director of the Missionary Servant Center for Collaborative Ministry; director of the Washington Archdiocesan Consultation and Counseling Center; and assistant director of the Center for Religion and Psychiatry, Washington, D.C.

Brother Sofield has served on the faculty of, or lectured at, many colleges and universities in the United States and in other countries. Much of his time has been spent conducting programs of clergy education and providing consultation to dioceses. He previously served on the Advisory Board of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Laity, Family, Women and Youth.

Brother Sofield has received a number of awards, including *Lumen Gentium*, conferred by the Conference for Pastoral Planning and Council Development; National Association of Lay Ministry's *Gaudium et Spes* award; and the National Association of Religious Brothers Called to Brotherhood Award
