

REPENT AND BELIEVE IN THE GOSPEL

Lent is the time of year we devote to scrutinizing our lives in the light of our baptism into the death and resurrection of Jesus. Today's readings are a nice shorthand catechism of what our baptized lives mean. As Noah passed through the waters of the flood to a covenant with God, so did we enter into a covenant, a promised relationship with God through our baptism.

Peter's letter gives an explicit explanation of what our baptism means: it is an appeal we make to God for a clear conscience. How do we obtain this clear conscience? The words proclaimed by Jesus immediately following his temptation show us the way: "Repent, and believe in the gospel" (Mark 1:15). It might be a good spiritual exercise to keep these readings before us throughout the entire season of Lent, a means to help us return to a life lived by our baptismal promises. Copyright © J. S. Pulled “Pork” Sandwiches

Serves: 6 Cook: 1 hr. 35 min.

Ingredients:

- 2 tablespoons of olive oil
- 1 medium onion
- 3 cloves garlic, minced.
- 3 cups of jackfruit, fresh or canned
- 2 teaspoons pepper
- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire
- 1 teaspoon liquid smoke
- 2 cups vegetable stock
- 1/2 cup BBQ sauce

Preparation:

1. Preheat your oven to 350
2. Heat the oil over medium heat in a large pan or Dutch oven
3. Add the onions and garlic, and cook until translucent
4. Add the jackfruit, spices, Worcestershire, and liquid smoke. Stir to coat evenly.
5. Add the vegetable stock and bring to simmer. Reduce heat, cover and simmer for 45 minutes, until the liquid is mostly absorbed and the fruit has broken down.
6. Spread the jackfruit on a prepared baking sheet.
7. Bake for 75 minutes, until the liquid has baked out and the jackfruit has a a deeper brown color.
8. Pour the barbecue sauce over the jackfruit.
9. Mix and return to the oven for 15 minutes.
10. Serve warm on buns with coleslaw


