SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

JULY 24, 2022

Theme: "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." (Gospel)

Pastor's Reflections



Reading I: Genesis 18:20-32a
Responsorial Psalm: 138:1-2,2-3,6-7,7-8
Reading II: Colossians 2:12-14
Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

"Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty," pleads Abraham in the First Reading. Abraham knows very well the goodness of God so he says, "Far be it from you to do such a thing!" As a man of faith, Abraham trusts the love and mercy of God. For ten innocent people, God is willing to preserve Sodom and Gomorrah.

In last Sunday's gospel, the Lord speaks of the better life. Mary sits at the foot of Jesus and listens to him. In the context of prayer, one who listens to God truly has the best part of life. Today's Gospel, the Lord teaches the true components of prayer. One has to trust the goodness of God for He never fails to provide. God knows our needs better than we do. *"He who does not pray deprives himself of what is indispensable in life"* (St. Jean Vianney).

The Lord's Prayer is a complete prayer. Jesus wants us to relate to God as intimate as possible calling Him Abba. His Kingdom or reign on us ought to come and stay. *"But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things*

will be given to you as well" (Mt. 6:33). St Therese of Avila says, *"There are more tears shed over answered prayers than over unanswered prayers."*

One notable fruit of prayer is God's own mercy in us and we should offer the same mercy to those who need mercy.

Let us pray: O God, protector of those who hope in you, without whom nothing has firm foundation, nothing is holy, bestow in abundance your mercy upon us and grant that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may use the good things that pass in such a way as to hold fast even now to those that ever endure. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever, Amen (Collect Prayer).

Reflexiones del Pastor

Lectura I: Génesis 18,20-32a
 Salmo Responsorial: 138:1-2,2-3,6-7,7-8
 Lectura II: Colosenses 2:12-14
 Evangelio: Lucas 11:1-13

Tema: "Señor, enséñanos a orar como Juan enseñó a sus discípulos" (Evangelio).

"Barrerás al inocente con el culpable", suplica Abraham en la Primera Lectura. Abraham conoce muy bien la bondad de Dios, por lo que dice: "¡Lejos esté de ti hacer tal cosa!" Como hombre de fe, Abraham confía en el amor y la misericordia de Dios. Por diez personas inocentes, Dios está dispuesto a preservar a Sodoma y Gomorra.

En el evangelio del domingo pasado, el Señor habla de lo mejor de la vida. María se sienta a los pies de Jesús y lo escucha. En el contexto de la oración, quien escucha a Dios verdaderamente tiene la mejor parte de la vida. En el Evangelio de hoy, el Señor enseña los verdaderos componentes de la oración. Uno tiene que confiar en la bondad de Dios y Él nunca deja de proveer. Dios conoce nuestras necesidades mejor que nosotros. "Quien no reza se priva de lo indispensable en la vida" (San Juan Vianney).

El Padrenuestro es una oración completa. Jesús quiere que nos relacionemos con Dios lo más íntimamente posible llamándolo Abba. Su Reino o reinar sobre nosotros debe venir y quedarse. "Mas buscad primeramente su reino y su justicia, y todas estas cosas os serán añadidas" (Mt 6,33). Santa Teresa de Ávila dice: "Se derraman más lágrimas por las oraciones contestadas que por las no contestadas".

Un fruto notable de la oración es la misericordia de Dios en nosotros y debemos ofrecer la misma misericordia a aquellos que necesitan misericordia.

Oremos: Oh Dios, protector de los que esperan en ti, sin el cual nada tiene fundamento firme, nada es santo, concédenos abundantemente tu misericordia y concédenos que, contigo como nuestro gobernante y guía, podamos usar el bien las cosas que pasan de tal manera que retienen incluso ahora a las que perduran para siempre. Por nuestro Señor Jesucristo, tu Hijo, que vive y reina contigo en la unidad del Espíritu Santo, un solo Dios, por los siglos de los siglos. Amén.

Reflection

In the New Testament, Jesus was asked by His disciples, "Teach us how to pray." When Jesus taught his disciples to pray He gave them the disciple's prayer, the Our Father or Lord's Prayer.

This powerful prayer tells us that God is the Father, the Creator, the Author and the origin of everything. Whenever I recite the prayer, I realize that our world and universe belongs to our Maker who made us in His own image. This is the world that we now know and care, where we have someone to speak to, someone to thank, and someone to reach out.

We who are in Christ can and must pray always with loving, tender confidence in our Redeemer, Jesus. Through His grace and power we can love and serve one another as Jesus taught, with mercy, forgiveness and loving kindness.

Do you treat others based on your emotions? Or do you treat them as the Lord Jesus would, with grace and mercy. Jesus' prayer includes a petition that we must ask for forgiveness, especially for those who wronged us. God's grace frees us from every form of anger, resentment, envy, and hatred. Are we always ready to forgive others as the Lord Jesus forgives us?

We have God the Father that we can always approach with confidence and boldness because Jesus Christ has opened the way to heaven through His death and resurrection. So when we ask for God's help, He does not give us what we deserve, instead He responds with grace, mercy, forgiveness and healing. He is kind and forgiving and He expects us to treat our neighbor the same as He treats His flock.

Prayer meditation: "Father in heaven, you have given me a mind to know you, a will to serve you, a heart to love you. Give me today the grace and strength to embrace your holy will and fill my heart with your love that all my intentions and actions may be pleasing to you. Help me to be kind and forgiving towards my neighbor as you have been towards me."
