

Responding with Compassion to Two Humanitarian Crises

We are experiencing at least two major humanitarian crises in our own part of the world. We soon expect to see the heartbreaking images of devastation caused by Hurricane Melissa, and our thoughts and prayers turn to our brothers and sisters in the Caribbean - especially in Jamaica, eastern Cuba, and Haiti. These regions, already burdened by poverty, have been struck by catastrophic winds and flooding that have destroyed homes, crops, and entire communities. The human suffering is immense, and our solidarity as disciples of Christ calls us to act with compassion and generosity. At the same time, we face a growing crisis closer to home. The fact that our Congress has failed to pass a budget is having more and more dangerous humanitarian consequences. The likely suspension this weekend of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) will deeply affect struggling members of our own local communities, and an average of one in every eight people across the nation. Even those who believe such programs should be smaller must admit that complete suspension is an inhumane way to accomplish this. For many of our neighbors, this will mean choosing between paying rent, keeping the heat on, or putting food on the table. The need for local support will only grow in the weeks ahead.
