

Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday)

Theme/Call To Worship

As we enter the Third Sunday of Advent, we are reminded to stay focused on the words of John the Baptist. "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord.""

Introduction To The Word

Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-1: Isaiah describes the joy and salvation which will accompany the coming of Christ. He compares the plants which spring from a garden to the justice that will spring from all nations.

<u>I Thessalonians 5:16-24</u>: In the second reading, we hear Paul's concluding words to his First Letter to the Thessalonians. Paul implores the Christians in the city of Thessalonica to "rejoice always" and constantly "give thanks" to God for Jesus Christ. He also offers up additional advice to the congregation: "Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophetic utterances. Test everything; retain what is good. Refrain from every kind of evil."

John 1:6-8, 19-28: The Gospel reading reveals some of the original reactions to John the Baptist. The Jerusalem priests and Levites were sent to determine, first and foremost, if John was the long-awaited Messiah. Once it was established that he was not, they then inquired if he was Elijah or the Prophet—two figures from Israel's history foretold as God's messengers (see Dt 18:15, 18 and 2 Kgs 2:11). John claimed to be neither Elijah returned nor the Prophet predicted by Moses. Out of exasperation, the religious leaders of Jerusalem asked John the final pointed question: "Who are you?" John acknowledged that he is the one prophesied by Isaiah. Still not satisfied, the Pharisees then questioned John's authority to baptize. John the Baptist's response ("I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie") reflects John the Evangelist's theology that runs throughout the Gospel: "the world" and non-believers do not recognize that Jesus is the Word made flesh (Jn 1:14).
