

Church of St. Thomas More March 01, 2015 Second Sunday of Lent

Theme/Call To Worship

The readings for the Second Sunday of Lent teach us the importance of listening to and trusting in the word of God. In doing so, we become God's "chosen ones."

Introduction To The Word

Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18: The first reading from the Book of Genesis is the story of Abraham's near sacrifice of his beloved son, Isaac. The opening sentence ("God put Abraham to the test") sets the context for the power of this story. The "test" was Abraham's depth of faith in God and whether Abraham would obey God's command, no matter how difficult. This story became key for the early Christians to understand Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross as the final atonement for all sin.

Romans 8:31b-34: The second reading is a short excerpt from Paul's Letter to the Romans. From the early Church Fathers to contemporary Christian theologians, Romans is widely regarded as Paul's most profound letter. The message in this section of the letter is clear enough: as "chosen ones," we have both God on our side, who loves us so much as to give his Son to us, and we have Jesus on our side, who intercedes for us to God in heaven.

Mark 9:2-10: The Gospel reading is the story of Jesus' transfiguration before the disciples. At the Transfiguration, God then tells the three disciples, "Listen to him." For the original apostles and for us Christians today, this becomes the central challenge in living out our faith. Jesus' words require us to think and act deeply and passionately about our relationships with God, self, and others. Listening to Jesus and trusting his message of salvation is not easy, but it does help us understand what it means to be God's "chosen ones."

Making All Things New Update

The Cluster teams of St. Francis de Sales, St. Ignatius Loyola, and St. Thomas More have been working together since November to consider Cardinal Dolan's proposal that the parishes of St. Ignatius Loyola and St. Thomas More merge. You will recall that we were asked to respond to the proposal by March 1, 2015.

We are happy to report that our deliberations are complete, and that we forwarded our response to Cardinal Dolan earlier this week.

What follows is a summary of our report.

Cardinal Dolan's proposal reads:

- 1. The Parishes of St. Ignatius Loyola and St. Thomas More will merge
- 2. The Church of St. Ignatius Loyola will be designated as the parish church.
- 3. At the present time, St. Thomas More, although remaining a church which may be used on special occasions, Masses and sacraments will not be celebrated.

Our Cluster teams carefully considered the proposal, taking into account all the stated goals of *Making All Things New*. We also addressed three specific concerns that had motivated the proposal: the vibrancy of the Catholic community in our area; the relative proximity of our two churches; and the financial stability of St. Thomas More.

Based on the following points, our unanimous conclusion was that the proposal is not a viable construction.


- I. We concluded that a merger of St. Thomas More with St. Ignatius Loyola would not enhance the vibrancy of the Catholic community, but in fact, would likely diminish it. In support of this, we identified what would be lost in terms of diversity of model, size, liturgical format, meeting space, programming, and charism.
- II. We concluded that the proximity of the parishes is not a compelling reason for merging because both churches are "destination parishes" which attract very different parishioners. We also noted that St. Thomas More is the only Roman Catholic Church located in Carnegie Hill.
- III. We concluded that St. Thomas More is on very strong financial footing, and that the expenses associated with maintaining a largely unused church building would suggest a strong financial drain on a newly formed parish.

It is the conviction of the Cluster teams that a merger between St. Thomas More and St. Ignatius Loyola would not further the goals of *Making All Things New*, but would create tremendous heartache and difficulty instead. In place of this, we proposed to Cardinal Dolan that St. Thomas More and St. Ignatius Loyola remain independent parishes, and that we collaborate with St. Francis de Sales to achieve the goals of *Making All Things New*.

Over the course of our meetings, we have developed a deep appreciation for one another's parishes, and we are committed to working in close collaboration, particularly focusing on programming for teens, which is sorely needed at all three parishes, and on building greater complementarity among programs that already exist.

The pastors of all three parishes and the chair of our cluster group will appear before the Archdiocesan Advisory Group on Monday, March 9th, to delve deeper into our response and to answer questions. A final decision about the status of the parishes in our cluster is expected from Cardinal Dolan by the end of April.
