Church of Our Lady of Good Counsel - St. Thomas More March 08, 2020 Second Sunday of Lent

The readings for the Second Sunday of Lent raise the importance of trust in our relationship with God. The spiritual journey of faith demands a level of trust and dependency that is modeled to us by Abraham and by Jesus' disciples. The first reading from the Book of Genesis is the call of Abraham. Four times in Genesis the call of Abraham is narrated: Genesis 12, 15, 17, and 22. Originating from different time periods in Israel's history, the call of Abraham was so central to how Israel understood itself that the Jewish scribes felt it was essential to preserve each version of the four calls. For the Israelites living during the period of the Monarchy, the call spoke to their times. Israel had truly become a "great nation," and Israel looked back at the call of Abraham and saw him as their great patriarch who was the first to trust God to be the guide for his people, and in doing so, was richly rewarded.

In the second reading, we hear Paul's words to one of his beloved and trusted coworkers, Timothy, in which Paul reminds him that God "saved us and called us to a holy life" which is not rooted in our own efforts but rather in "the grace bestowed on us in Christ Jesus."

In the Gospel reading, we hear Matthew's account of the transfiguration of Jesus, and although the members of Matthew's community would have been very receptive to hearing about Jesus in the context of their own traditional sacred stories, Matthew is interested in teaching his community that God is doing something new, that God's definitive revelation now lies with his beloved Son, the new lawgiver.

GUIDELINES IN LIGHT OF THE SPREAD OF THE CORONA VIRUS

With the introduction of the novel coronavirus (Covid-19) into the metropolitan area, it is advisable to take some sensible steps in regard to how we comport ourselves at mass in order to prevent clergy or members of the congregation from transmitting or acquiring the virus.

Attendance at Mass. If you are not feeling well and have flulike symptoms, consider yourself free of the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. It might be more considerate of others not to come to church that Sunday.

The Sign of Peace. Instead of shaking hands with the person next to you, simply nod or wave or give an "elbow bump."

Holy Communion. The ministers of the Eucharist should cleanse their hands with sanitizer before and after they distribute the sacred hosts. It is suggested that in receiving Holy Communion, you would do so in the hand, rather than on the tongue. With the distribution of the Eucharist on the tongue, there is always the possibility of saliva coming onto the minister's fingers, which could then be passed onto the remaining hosts, possibly transmitting the virus to another congregant or to the minister of the Eucharist.

Out of concern for the health of the Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, who graciously volunteer their service, if you should wish to receive the Eucharist on the tongue, we ask that you approach the priest.

Greeting after Mass. The celebrant will not be shaking hands with the members of the congregation as they leave mass.

Prayer. Let us pray for all those who are suffering throughout the world and for all medical personnel who are attending to their needs with such care and dedication.
