Wisdom and the Law

In the Gospel, Jesus challenges us to look more deeply into the commandments to see the values that they are trying to preserve. This requires a certain level of maturity, as Paul suggests in the second reading: “We speak a wisdom to those who are mature, not a wisdom of this age.”

When we are children, rules need to be rather black and white; at a young age, we are not yet mature enough to evaluate the purpose of the rule or when it might not apply. If we mature in our faith, however, we gain the ability to discern more carefully, to make sure that the purpose of the rule is fulfilled and that the rule is not impeding its own goals.

This kind of discernment is necessary for moral issues, as Pope Francis has indicated more than once. “We have been called to form consciences, not to replace them,” he wrote in his apostolic exhortation on the family (Joy of Love #37). The same principle applies to liturgical laws and rules, too. The mature pastor or planner takes time to understand the reason for a law or rule and then strives to fulfill its purpose, even if at times that means adapting the law to a present situation. This is very different from simply ignoring any rules we don’t like, as it is very different from unthinking obedience to every rubric. Let us pray for the maturity and wisdom to embrace the law as Jesus did, going beyond the letter of the law to live its values and seek its goals.

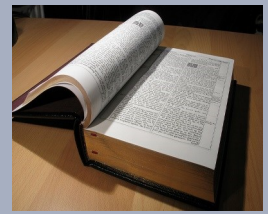

Saint Cyril Feast Day

February 14th

February 14th is the Feast Day for St. Cyril and St. Methodius. Notice in the above Icon and statues the men look like each other. That is because they were brothers. Do you know which brother is St. Cyril? Is he the one who is holding a scroll of the Cyrillic Alphabet? Or is he the philosopher and university scholar holding the translated scriptures on the left? Most sources believe St. Cyril is the one on the right dressed as a monk, however, both men were missionaries who later became Bishops.

According to John Delaney's *Dictionary of Saints*, "as a priest and monk on assignment to convert other countries, they actually invented the Glagolothic alphabet together which marked the beginning of Slavonic literature." The use of the Slavonic language in the liturgy was met with opposition in several countries but over the years with Papal support the brothers were successful in helping spread the word about Jesus throughout all the Slavonic language nations of Eastern Europe such as Russia, Serbia, The Ukraine, and Bulgaria. They are known as the "Apostles to the Slavs." What a great contribution they made to the world!

St. Cyril died at age 43 on February 14th shortly after becoming a monk and is buried at the Basilica of San Clemente in Rome, Italy. St. Methodius continued their work as missionaries, was an Abbot of a Monastery in Greece, and ultimately became a Bishop in the Church. He died at the age of 70.

Thanksgiving Dinner Summary

St. Cyril Catholic Church had plans underway in 2016 to provide our 3rd Thanksgiving Day dinner to those within the Wilsonville community. As you may remember, this idea was borne from the need to minister to those within our local church and neighborhood community who were without family nearby, or unable to participate in the celebration of a Thanksgiving meal due to limited resources.

The planning team involved other community churches and agencies who provided advertising support. St. Francis of Sherwood, Resurrection Church of Tualatin and Valley Christian Church of Wilsonville all participated in spreading the word of invitation to those who might need a place for dinner. Additional advertising was placed at the Wilsonville Senior Center, Wilsonville Community Sharing Food Bank, the I-5 north and south rest areas just outside of Wilsonville, and the local Can and Bottle Return areas.

As happened in the past, our attendance grew, despite, a day plagued by ferocious rain. And for those who couldn't make it tireless volunteers delivered meals to their homes and dropped off meals at the rest areas, where many people find shelter and set up some temporary lodging.

The hearts and souls of the generous St. Cyril parishioners was all that was needed to respond to this need with their time, energy and monetary donations.
