

## Third Sunday of Lent

A woman encounters Jesus at Jacob's well while drawing water for her household. Their thirst brings them together. Given the strict rules of public decorum regarding encounters between men and women not of the same family this chance meeting could have been over before it began. Add to this that Jews and Samaritans had been the bitterest of enemies for centuries. Their hatred for one another and hostility toward the other knew few if any equals.

But yet, the two sit, talk and *listen* to one another. Through their mutual acceptance of the other, the walls, boundaries, hostilities and hatreds, which had long separated Samaritans and Jews, melt away and disappear. The Samaritan woman comes to understand who Jesus is. Initially he is a Jew, the despised and hated other. As he candidly speaks of her marital history, she comes to believe that he is a prophet. As Jesus teaches her and reveals more of his identity the woman says, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes he will tell us everything." Jesus replies, "I am he, the one who is speaking to you." The woman then hurries away excitedly, to tell others in the town about this extraordinary man at the well. She asks, "Could he possibly be the Christ?" After *listening* to the woman and then *listening* to Jesus, the townspeople come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah. The author of John's Gospel says, "The woman left her water jar and went into the town." Perhaps, knowing she was coming back, she knew she could retrieve it later.

Or, did the author intend another meaning? Could the jar left behind serve as a metaphor for the life she had been living?

**St. Patrick** was a fifth-century Romano-British Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland. Known as the "Apostle of Ireland", he is the primary patron saint of Ireland, the other patron saints being Brigit of Kildare and Columba. He is venerated in the Catholic Church. he was active as a missionary in Ireland during the fifth century.

When he was about 16, he was captured by Irish pirates from his home in Britain and taken as a slave to Ireland, looking after animals; he lived there for six years before escaping and returning to his family. After becoming a cleric, he returned to northern and western Ireland where, around 432, he became a bishop to succeed St. Paulinus who had died the previous year.

He visited Rome in 442 and 444, founded the Cathedral Church of Armagh which soon became the center of the Catholic Church's activities in Ireland. During his thirty years in Ireland he raised the standard of scholarship, encouraged the study of Latin, and brought Ireland into closer relationship with the rest of the Western Church. By the seventh century, he had already come to be revered as the patron saint of Ireland.

# **Facility Update**

As you have probably noticed, we have several projects in the works around the St Cyril campus.

1. The markings along the street and parking area in front of the Parish Office is to mark the utilities prior to working on the septic system. The Parish Office is currently on a septic system rather than the City sewer. We recently learned the septic tank is compromised and will need to be removed, per the City of Wilsonville. Once we have all permits, and the "okay" from the City, the septic tank will be removed, the hole filled and the Parish Office connected to the sewer.

- 2. The Parish Hall roof is an ongoing project that we are taking very seriously and weighing all options. At this time we are looking at several quotes to determine how to move forward. We hope to begin this major project early summer. More information to come as we move along and learn more.
- 3. It's also Safety First Grant time again! As some of you may remember, the Safety First Grant is offered once a year by the Archdiocese and parishes may apply for a matching grant up to \$10,000 to improve the safety of the parish campus. Once we have applied, been approved and the summer progresses you will see projects get underway.
- 4. We recently installed a new hot water heater in the sacristy. There were a few issues with the new hot water heater when it was first installed but we seem to have gotten the kinks out and it's working quite well at this time.
