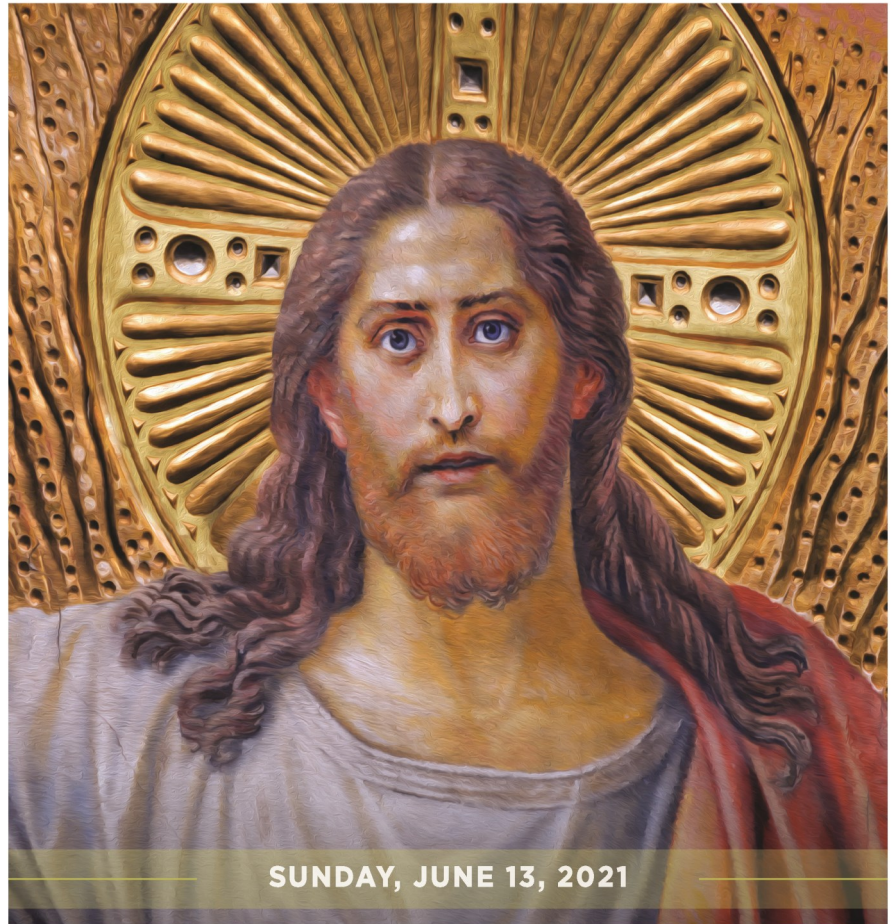

### \$300 - \$600 Tax Deduction Available for Charitable Contributions through 2021

The "Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021" included a provision that extends the charitable tax deduction through 2021.

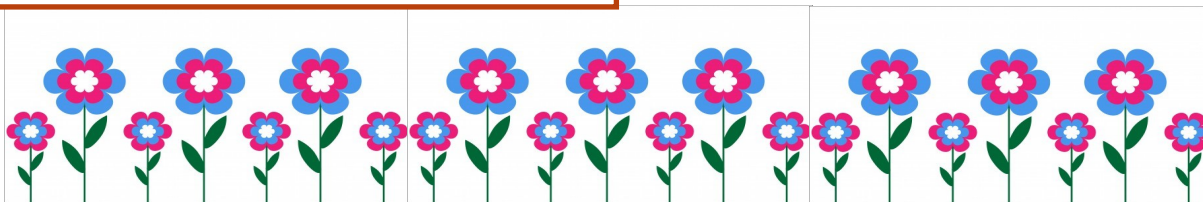
This means any taxpayer who takes the standard deduction (instead of itemizing) can receive a \$300 tax deduction (\$600 for married filing jointly) for donations to eligible non-profit organizations like St Cyril.
