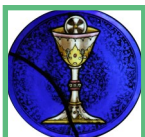

REFLECTION

When I was in middle school, there were times I didn't want my fellow students to see my parents drop me off or pick me up in the school parking lot. I was embarrassed of my parents. Why? I have no idea. Maybe it was our station wagon. Or I didn't want to look like a little kid. But in retrospect that was a silly thing to do. I was a kid. And I had two parents who loved me and had built a wonderful family. I was afraid of the other kids' judgment. How silly! I should have been afraid of forgetting or downplaying my family, which is where my identity had its deep roots. This is a way to understand Jesus' words to his disciples this Sunday, when he says, "Don't be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." Fear, in this sense, refers to where we find our deepest identity and our highest love. That's why Jesus says next that when we acknowledge him before others, he will acknowledge us before the Father. It doesn't mean we're brash or boastful. But rather we unhesitatingly and humbly embrace our identity as followers of Jesus and children of God the Father. After all, if we love who we are and where we come from, who cares what the other kids think about us?

"Blue Envelope"/Maintenance & Repairs Update

In the weekly bulletin, the Your Sunday Collections indicates how much has been collected from the Maintenance & Repairs envelopes during the fiscal year. As of June 11th, **\$18,429.86** has been collected. As for expenses this year, we have had to dip into our Maintenance & Repairs reserves to cover the major projects. All the projects were necessary to keep our parish campus in working order and have totaled **\$41,165.36**. These projects have included 3 new furnaces for the Church, a new ice machine, powder coating of the Church handrails, asphalt repair of the Parish Hall parking lot entrance, replace the 3 posts at the east entrance of the Church and lastly, the matching Safety First Grant project, parking lot sealcoating and striping. As our parish ages we will continue to have major maintenance and repairs. We appreciate the generosity of the parishioners who donate through the "Blue Envelope" to the Maintenance & Repair Fund, it is a vital part of this parish.
