


# Break Apart Addends as Tens and Ones

$$25 + 46 = ?$$

Break apart 25 into tens and ones.



Break apart 46 into tens and ones.

Then, add the tens from the two addends.

$$\underline{20} + \underline{40} = \underline{60}$$

Add the ones from the two addends.

$$\underline{5} + \underline{6} = \underline{11}$$


Add the two sums.

$$\underline{60} + \underline{11} = \underline{71}$$

$$\text{So, } 25 + 46 = \underline{71}.$$

**Break apart the addends to find the sum.**

1.  $12 + 48 = ?$
