Sage had a red bag. Sage took books. He took a saw to cut wood.


Joe went to the city. Seth went to the hills. Sage went to the country.

"I am going to the store. I will buy milk for my mother. I have three dollars."


"I have a magic sunflower plant."

From that plant a tall sunflower plant grew. It went to the sky.




