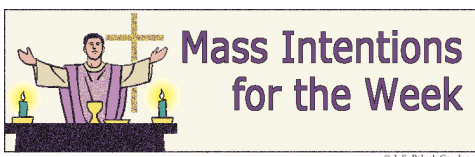

Deacon's Reflection

The first Sunday of Lent starts out with Jesus returning from the Jordan and being led by the Spirit to the desert for forty days to be tempted by the devil. Returning from the Jordan is a reminder of the Baptism of our Lord, and the 40 days in the desert is a reminder of the Israelites wandering in the desert for 40 years. We, also, are on our Lenten journey for 40 days to resist temptations, pray, fast and give alms.

Throughout history, the devil has tempted many close to God, especially Saints. When the devil fears that someone is doing great damage to his hellish kingdom, he goes after that person.

I recently watched Padre Pio Miracle Man movie about Saint Padre Pio of Pietrelcina, Italy, who was tormented and tempted by the devil often. The devil would cause him mental and physical violence that included accusations, doubts, provocations and enticements. Seventeen Saints battled the devil, including St. Anthony of Padua and St. Benedict. St. Benedict was tempted to lust when the devil brought to his memory an attractive woman he once knew, and St. Benedict was almost overcome with passion until he threw himself into a briar patch and rolled around in the thorns until the temptation was gone. As a reference, a good book is "Saints Who Battled Satan" by Dr. Paul Thigpen.



It seemed to me that the closer one is to God, the more the devil tries to lead one into temptation and then the battle begins. We should not be fearful of this, but know from 1 John 4:4-6, "Little children, you are of God, and have overcome them; for he who is in you is greater than he who is in the world. They are of the world, therefore what they say is of the world, and the world listens to them. We are of God. Whoever knows God listens to us, and he who is not of God does not listen to us. By this we know the spirit of truth and the spirit of error." They took the devil seriously, but they knew he is ultimately defeated.

Some ways to fight back at temptation is daily praying the Lord's Prayer, the Rosary, the St. Michael's Prayer, and frequent the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Eucharist. A tradition in the church is to ask a priest or deacon for a home blessing that blesses all the members of your household and surround them with protection, that they may find peace in Jesus Christ.

During this Lent instead of just giving up chocolate or soda, let us add humility, fervent prayer, fasting and almsgiving.
