God Alone!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



Last Sunday we celebrated Divine Mercy Sunday, a feast requested by our Lord to Sr. Faustina Kowalska in 1936: "The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy" (Diary, 669).

In preparation for that beautiful feast, we prayed together for nine days prior, the Novena to the Divine Mercy. On the ninth day, Jesus asks us to bring to Him and to immerse in the fount of His Mercy, all souls that are lukewarm. Again, he told Sr. Faustina, "Today bring to Me souls who have become lukewarm and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy. These souls wound My Heart most painfully. My soul suffered the most dreadful loathing in the Garden of Olives because of lukewarm souls" (Diary 1228).

In these days when we have witnessed such devastation and sickness in our world, the Lord is inviting the world to turn back to Him, and to those who already follow Him, to be raised up from their lukewarmness of soul. As I reflected with you in my letter of Easter, the Lord wants to rekindle the flame of His divine life in our souls as He did for the apostles on the way to Emmaus. He reminded them of how lukewarm their hearts had quickly become: "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke!" (Luke 24:25). The Lord wants to do this for us not just for our own sake but

for the sake of the many souls in the world who have turned away from God, who do not know God and the life He desires for us, and who without the witness of fervent disciples of Jesus would lose the grace of salvation.

Thus in these remaining days of the Easter season, I want to reflect and deepen our understanding of lukewarmness and prepare our hearts to ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle them and make them fervent for Jesus, His Church, and all the many spiritual gifts which He has given to us. Whether we like it or not, and whether we want to or not, all of us are part of a spiritual battle, which in these last several years has grown even more intense, and within these past several months has revealed even more plainly the battlefield: the souls for which Christ died and rose again! How many souls are saved or lost, how much the world will suffer, how much evil will be held at bay, will depend on how alert and how serious we take our commitment to follow Christ, and our commitment to remain faithful to Him. Jesus himself once revealed to St. Therese of Lisieux that countless souls depended on the manner with which she lived her religious vows in the life of Carmel. St. Faustina too came to this realization in her own spiritual life as a Sister of Mercy, "I strive for the greatest perfection possible in order to be useful to the Church. Greater by far is my bond to the Church. The sanctity or the fall of each individual soul has an effect upon the whole Church. Observing myself and those who are close to me, I have come to understand how great an influence I have on other souls, not by any heroic deeds, as these are striking in themselves, but by small actions like a movement of the hand, a look, and many other things too numerous to mention, which have an effect on and reflect in the souls of others, as I myself have noticed. (Diary, 1475).

More than ever, Jesus is calling us to a greater fervor in following Him in whatever vocation, state in life, or circumstances we find ourselves in. Even those who are homebound, sick, and who feel they have nothing to offer the Lord, are being called in these days, to become fervent lovers of Jesus, so that relying on our love and commitment, He may unite our efforts to the outpouring of His grace for that which is most dear to His heart: the salvation of souls.



BLE STUDY Men, women, young adults and teens can now complete a home Bible Study online through the group "Walking With Purpose" found on Facebook and at WalkingWithPurpose.com. Presently, it consists of a breakdown of the upcoming Sunday readings. This allows you to come before your TV each Sunday morning for the livestream Mass prepared to hear and to understand what is being said. It is a program that should be used each of the 5 days of the week prior to Sunday. It is a supplement, not a replacement, for what you already do at home, the title being "Defining Moments." The five segments include: 1) 1st Sunday reading, 2) responsorial psalm, 3) 2nd reading, finally 4) and 5) "pulls apart" the Gospel. Also included is an explanation of Spiritual Communion for those who are still pondering what exactly it means to "receive" a Spiritual Communion with a suggestion of the words you may want to say to obtain this Communion.
