FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

God Alone!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the past month we have witnessed the world descend into even greater darkness as world events turn more critical day by day: unashamed contempt for human life in the womb, confusion regarding the identity of the human person created in the image and likeness of God, the abandonment of Christian faith and morals, and its mockery by elected leaders of nations by their personal actions and civil legislation, the reestablishment of ideological extremism, and the renewed potential for the global expansion of terrorism. Add to this the curtailment of religious freedom and conscience rights, the dissolution of common sense and reasoning, and the resultant turning of brother against brother, treating one another with contempt and suspicion. The backdrop of today's world seems to reflect what Jesus says in Matthew's Gospel, "Brother will hand over brother to death...and many will be led into sin; they will betray and hate one another. Many false prophets will arise and deceive many; and because of the increase of evildoing, the love of many will grow cold" (Matthew 10:21; 24: 10-12). Man has forsaken God and refuses to listen to Him, and when this happens, an abyss will open in men's souls and in the world, which if not filled with God's life and light, will be consumed by the malfeasance of the father of lies and his darkness.

Against this backdrop, I wish to reflect with you on the only one, whose perfect existence was consumed by God: our most holy and sweet Blessed Mother. As we did in August, we shall celebrate this month,

several important feasts, related to her life. Just as Moses encountered God in the wilderness in the burning bush that was enveloped by fire but not consumed, so Mary is the fulfillment of that encounter. She was totally enveloped by God's grace but was not annihilated. She perfectly enjoyed the Divine Life of God, lost by our first parents who refused to listen to God, and by her obedience and her *FIAT*, all those who take refuge in her will know her protection and will share in an abundance of God's life and light.

On September 8th, the Church will celebrate the feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, an important feast for us, for by her very birth, she announced the salvation of man and the renewal of all things in her Son, Jesus, our Savior. Concerning the mystery of her birth, St. Andrew of Crete writes, "Today the Virgin is born, tended and formed and prepared, for her role as the Mother of God, who is the universal King of the ages. Justly, then, do we celebrate this mystery since it signifies for us a double grace. We are led to the truth, and we are led away from



our condition to slavery...how can this be? Darkness yields before the coming of the light...and the old is replaced by the new...Therefore, let all creation sing and dance and unite to make worthy contribution to the celebration of this day. Today...the creature is newly prepared to be a divine dwelling place for the Creator."

Today, more than ever, I am inviting everyone who reads these words, to personally consecrate themselves to Mary, the Mother of God. Beyond having a reverence for her, we must give ourselves wholly to her, for she is the ark who will protect us from the coming flood of darkness. She is the ark in whom will always be found Jesus, "whom even the winds and sea obey" (Matthew 8:27).
