Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Let this be the Christmas during which we can draw closer to him whose birth we celebrate.





THE SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD Saturday, January 1st, is the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. A vigil Mass will take place on Friday, December 31st at 4:00 p.m. On Saturday morning, Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 a.m.

FUNERAL SERVERS NEEDED The loss of a loved one can be a devasting time for any family, and, among other things, a funeral Mass is an important opportunity for us to help bring God's comfort and healing to the grieving. The Spiritual Works of Mercy instruct us to "comfort the sorrowful" and "pray for the living and the dead," and the Corporal Works of Mercy tell us to "bury the dead." Are you willing to be part of our team of volunteer funeral altar servers? Funerals typically take place a few times a month on a weekday at 10:00 or 11:00 a.m. If you are on the volunteer funeral server list, you will be in the rotation to receive a phone call for availability when funeral arrangements are being made through the office. This is a volunteer opportunity, and if you have another commitment at the time of a particular funeral, you can always decline. Please see Deacon Ray if you are interested.

UPDATED ONLINE GIVING SYSTEM Parishsoft continues to work on the upgrade to our online giving system. Due to staffing issues that many companies are experiencing, there have been delays with the migration of online giving history from the old system to the new one. The record of any donations made since the system transition began in November are accessible to you through your online giving account. Donations made prior to the upgrade will also be available online soon as the upgrade progresses. If you had a recurring offertory gift set up in the previous system, you have probably noticed that it is still working smoothly with the new system and there is no need to reenter it. If you did not have any recurring donations set up in the old system, Parishsoft informed us after the printing of the last bulletin that, indeed, those accounts will also be migrated to the new system, most likely by the time you read this announcement. You do not need to create a new account after all. If you were unable to log into online giving in the last few weeks, you should have no trouble logging in now.

Some special collections are now available as an option for online giving, including Christmas and the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. The rest of the special collections will soon be available as an online option as well. Please keep an eye on the bulletin to find out when the transition to the new system is complete and learn about some convenient new features.
