

God Alone!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



Continuing our reflection from where we left off last week, we now look at the dogma of Transubstantiation regarding the Most Holy Eucharist. We reflected last week that everything that exists in this world is either substance or accident. How does this, then, apply to the Eucharist? In order to understand the change that occurs, let us look at the before and after snapshots. Before the words of consecration are prayed at Mass, what is present before us? The substance of unleavened bread and the substance of wine pressed from grapes are what is presented to the priest to be offered. Both the bread and the wine also have certain accidents or characteristics. The bread is white. and it smells like wheat. It tastes like wheat. It is pressed into a round shape. The wine has certain accidents as well. It is a particular color and possesses the taste and aroma of grapes

which have been fermented. However, when the priest prays the words of consecration over the elements, a change occurs, not visible to the senses, in which the substance of the bread and the substance of the wine cease to exist. To their very core, the reality of those elements has ceased to be what they are. What they have become is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus, the Son of God. However, even though the substance of these elements has changed, their accidents have not. The Lord permits the color, the aroma, and the taste of fermented grapes to remain as well. However, these characteristics are retained simply by His grace. He preserves them. It must also be stated that the Lord's presence does not co-exist side by side with the substance of bread and wine. The substance of the bread and wine have been completely changed and no longer exist. As the Council of Trent reaffirmed, "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation."

If the Lord desired, he could allow the accidental properties of the Eucharist to disappear, so that His true presence would be revealed. And He has! Throughout history, on many occasions, true flesh and true blood have appeared after the words of consecration were prayed over the elements. In the Eucharistic miracles that have been allowed by the Church to be studied, the same human flesh of heart muscle has been found to be present and the same AB blood type has been discovered. Incidentally, the same blood type has been found on the Shroud of Turin as well as on the burial cloth that covered the face of Jesus, also known as the Sudarium in Oviedo, Spain. One of the most famous miracles of the Eucharist is the Miracle of Lanciano, Italy. It is well worth the time to read about it or to revisit it if we are already familiar with the occurrence of the miracle. One of the books I have on my coffee table to read, which was just published this past November, is by a Dr. Franco Serafini. Its title says it all--*A Cardiologist examines Jesus: The Stunning Science Behind Eucharistic Miracles*.

Ultimately, the dogma of Transubstantiation is about the radical love of God for His people. That Jesus, to whom all honor and glory belong, would allow Himself to remain hidden under the appearances of what looks like bread and what looks like wine, and to remain a prisoner of our Tabernacles, defies human logic. Only the love of God could do something this amazing!
