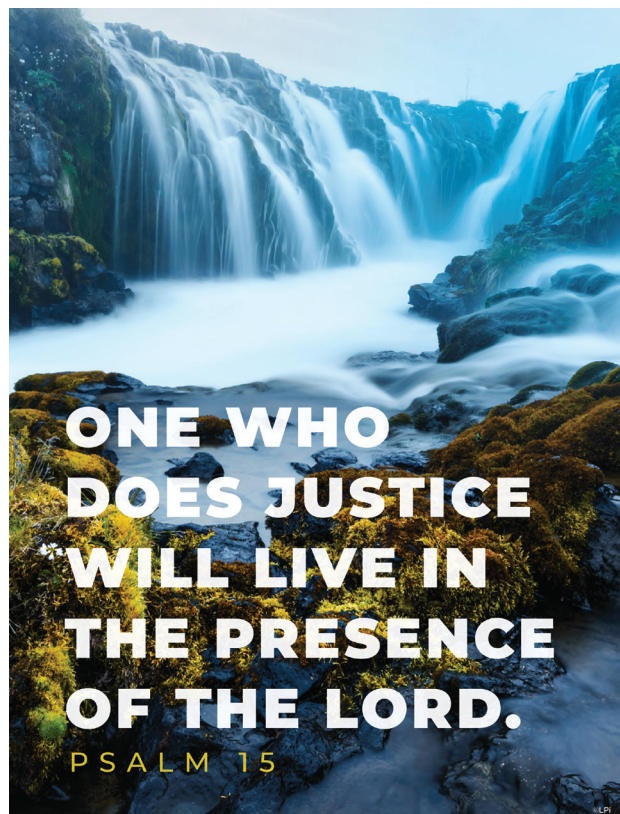

DISCONTINUED COLLECTIONS

This is a reminder that the Parish to Parish Support second collection that normally occurs in July has been discontinued at all parishes. With the implementation of the New Hampshire Catholic Appeal (NHCA), the following second collections are discontinued: 1. Parish to Parish Support, 2. Diocesan Seminarian Fund, 3. NH Missionaries Abroad, 4. Catholic University & USCCB, 5. NH Diocesan Priest Retirement, 6. Catholic Charities of New Hampshire, and the 7th which is no longer required but is still optional at the discretion of parishes is the Catholic Schools Collection. These causes previously supported by individual second collections are now supported by the one, annual New Hampshire Catholic Appeal (NHCA). The NHCA was implemented in 41 of the 89 New Hampshire parishes in May 2022 and all parishes will participate in the NHCA in May 2023. ENTHRONEMENT OF THE SACRED HEART IN THE HOME

Now that our Diocese and our parishes have enthroned the Sacred Heart of our Lord in the midst of their respective communities, every family is invited to personally enthrone the Sacred Heart in their own home, so that the Lord may be the King of their families.

The Enthronement of the Sacred Heart means the official and social recognition of the loving kingship of the Heart of Jesus in the Christian family. The family acknowledges this recognition by solemnly installing an image of the Sacred Heart in a place of honor in the home and dedicating itself to Him by an Act of Consecration. The Enthronement of the Sacred Heart is the recognition of the living presence of our Lord in the home, where His Divine Heart, as King of Love, is the center of the family, attracting all its members.

Jesus is invited to participate in all activities of the family. He then sanctifies all the details of home life. By the Enthronement and under the influence of the Sacred Heart, each member learns intimacy with Jesus. Either as a family or individually, each will grow in confidence and love with the One who longs for our love. Thus, the gift of the Enthronement is an awareness of His Living Presence in the family and a source of grace and blessings for the family.
