

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Labor Day weekend has finally arrived, which marks the unofficial end of the summer season and the return to the everyday rhythm of life; I hope and pray that everyone had a blessed and enjoyable summer with family and friends—a time to rest and renew.

As we head towards the Fall Season, there are several wonderful events that will be taking place to help us grow in our faith and in our relationship with the Lord.

The first of these events will take place on **Sunday, September 18th at 2:00PM** at **St. Kathryn Parish**. All are invited to join Bishop Peter and the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary to celebrate a special Mass of Thanksgiving in honor of the Canonization of Saint Anne-Marie Rivier, the foundress of the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary. Saint Anne-Marie Rivier was canonized at the Vatican on May 15, 2022 along with nine other Blesseds: Bl. Titus Brandsma, Bl. Maria of Jesus, Bl. Charles de Foucauld, Bl. Devasahayam Pillai, Bl. Cesar de Bus, Bl. Luigi Maria Palazzolo, Bl. Fr. Justin Russolillo, Bl. Anna Maria Rubatto, and Bl. Maria Domenica Mantovani.

St. Anne-Marie Rivier founded her religious order of sisters during the time of the French Revolution, when many convents and religious orders were being dissolved and the practice of the Catholic faith had to go underground. The newly founded order of the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary, however, began to flourish and dedicated itself to the education and religious instruction of the young. Mother Rivier foresaw that her sisters would one day cross the ocean and that prophecy was fulfilled on October 18, 1853 in Ste. Hyacinthe, Quebec. Twenty years later, a foundation would be established in the United States in 1873 at Glens Falls, New York. Today, St. Rivier is an inspiration to all those who seek

to live their faith in Christ in an anti-religious atmosphere and an anti-Christian society. As she said, "I wish you an ardent love for Jesus Christ, and I pray to Him that He might be your light, your strength, your rampart, your rock and your citadel."

The second of these events will be the Diocesan Eucharistic Revival entitled, Ignite New Hampshire. In response to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops for a three-year Eucharistic Revival, our Diocese is sponsoring a one day Eucharistic Revival event to take place at the Bank of New Hampshire Pavilion in Gilford, New Hampshire on Saturday, September 24th from 8:00AM to 2:30PM. Catholic faithful from throughout the Diocese are invited to join with Bishop Peter for a day of prayer to honor Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. It will feature one of the National



SAINT KATHRYN RELIGIOUS GOODS

Last week's store news announcing our selection and display of sports medals touched on a point that has come up in the store since it opened and should probably have been touched on a bit more, so we will do it today in this writing.

Since the store began we have always had customers come in and buy an item such as a medal, crucifix, bracelet etc. and in many cases a comment by them led us to understand that they believed the item had already been blessed before they purchased it. This is never the case. For whatever specific reason, Catholic religious goods may not be sold pre-blessed (for lack of a better term).

We commented in passing in last week's blurb about presenting your athlete with a blessed sports medal to begin the season. What we could have and maybe should have said is exactly what we stated above, any religious item you purchase from our store is never blessed and you need to have either Deacon Ray or Father Michael bless it for you. The blessing is quick but in our opinion very necessary. Otherwise it's just a piece of metal or wood.

This is also the reason that we are very careful when anyone comes in to "donate" religious items from an estate, a deceased relative, etc. we must be very careful with how we treat them and generally assume they have been blessed.

In thanksgiving for the canonization of Saint Anne Marie Rivier, on May 15, 2022, a Mass of Thanksgiving will be celebrated at St. Kathryn Parish.

All are invited to join Bishop Peter Libasci and the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary Sunday, September 18, 2022 at 2:00PM.

The Life of Saint Anne Marie Rivier, Foundress of the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary

Marie Rivier, fondly known as Marinette, was bom December 19, 1768 in Montpezat, France. At the end of April 1770, Marinette, then sixteen months old, had a bad fall which left her severely handicapped. Her mother, a woman of great faith, carried her to the statue of the Pieta each day. Soon the little girl, who watched her mother pray, was certain: "The Blessed Virgin will cure me!" Finally, on September 8, 1774, Marinette began to walk!

On November 21, 1796, the feast of the Presentation of Mary in the Temple, Marie and her four companions consecrated themselves to God. The new community grew very quickly despite the poverty it experienced. For Marie Rivier and her daughters, the Christian education of youth was and will remain a priority. However, religious education extended to adults as well.

When she died on February 3, 1838, this Woman-Apostle with a heart of fire had founded 141 houses and had received more than 350 Sisters to continue her mission. Marie Rivier was beatified in Rome by Pope John Paul II, on May 23, 1982 and canonized by Pope Francis, on May 15. 2022.

Today, the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary serve in nineteen countries of the world. In the United States, they are located in Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Rhode Island. –taken from presentationofmary-usa.org
