God Alone!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



On this most holy of days, we rejoice, for our Savior is born for "The angel of the Lord appeared to them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were struck with great fear. The angel said them, 'Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and **Lord.** And this will be a sign for you; you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger'" (Luke 2: 9-12).

May these words enter our hearts deeply on this beautiful feast of Christmas! One of the most often repeated phrases in the

Scriptures is the announcement of the angel to the shepherds: *Do not be afraid.* This Christmas, the infant Christ wants us to ponder this announcement. It is the reason God appeared to us as a tiny child. It is the reason God took on our humanity. It is why the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, so that He may reinforce our hearts with the confidence that He is always with us, no matter what. Yet, it is interesting to note that these words have been spoken by the Lord from the beginning of the plan of redemption, which began with the call of Abraham in the Old Testament. Abraham was the father of the people of Israel, from whom the Messiah would be born. When God called Abraham to begin the journey to the Promised Land, He told Him, "*Do not fear!*" (Gen. 15:1). From the very beginning, God knew how He was going to redeem man, who had disobeyed Him and fallen. God knew how He was going to reconcile man back to Himself; man who after sinning, said to the Lord, "*I heard you in the garden, but I was afraid…so I hid*" (Gen. 3: 10). God, who dwells in invisbile light, would Himself become visible. Man hid but God revealed Himself: "*For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord!*"

As we all look out at the world today, in the great mass of confusion, violence and the violation of innocent human life, appalling immorality, and the denial of truth and all that is good...as we hear men call good what is evil, and reject as evil what is good...as we witness leaders and legislators, scientists and shepherds seek to repudiate God and "reset and reshape" the world in man's image and likeness, the message of Christmas endures. God continues to say to us, "Do not be afraid." God continues to remain Messiah and Lord, "and of his kingdom there will be no end" (Luke 1:33).

So, on this Christmas day, let us gaze upon the One who is our Peace. Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus Christ, our Savior who has been born for us. This is the good news that is for all people! I wish every one of you and your families the joy of the Savior during these holy days. May each of you know the nearness of Him who continues to love us and may we recall often His words to us, to not be afraid, for He is our "Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-forever, Prince of Peace!" (Is. 9:5). May the comfort of the Christ child fill you and may the powerful intercession of Mary, His Mother, surround you. A blessed and Merry Christmas to all!
