


NO GREATER LOVE

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

Groundhog Day is this Thursday, February 2nd. Across the country, groundhogs will be awakened from their hibernation and brought outside. According to folklore, if the groundhog sees its shadow, there will be six more weeks of winter. If it doesn't see its shadow, then spring will come early. Although Groundhog Day is a secular American holiday, started in Pennsylvania in 1887, it has Catholic roots dating back to the Middle Ages. The groundhog tradition is based on the Catholic Candlemas tradition. "If Candlemas Day is clear and bright, winter will have another bite. If Candlemas Day brings clouds and rain, winter is gone and will not come again." Candlemas, or the blessing of the candles, is the day the Church blesses all the candles used throughout the year. February 2nd is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. The feast celebrates the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple as well as the Purification of Mary, which was required by Mosaic Law to take place forty days after the birth of a child. As we consider the Feast of the Presentation, we remember that we were presented at church for our baptism and received a candle lit from the paschal candle. The priest announces, "You have been enlightened by Christ. Walk always as a child of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in your heart. When the Lord comes, may you go out to meet Him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom." Sincerely,


