

God Alone!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



As we continue our reflection on the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we now turn our attention to the next major development which began at the second Vatican Council. The Order of Penance that was formalized at the Council of Trent in 1551 remained unchanged until the Second Vatican Council. On December 4, 1963 the document on the Sacred Liturgy promulgated that. "The rite and formulae of Penance are to be revised so that they more clearly express both the nature and effect of the sacrament" (72). It would be this direction of the Council Fathers which would give the Church the revised text of the Order of Penance which we have today. The new Order of Penance, however, would not be approved and published in Latin until 1973. Then in 1975 the typical English edition would be published for use in the vernacular.

In understanding the difference between the pre-Conciliar and post-Conciliar Order of Penance, I quote from a reflection of Cardinal James Stafford who offered these thoughts, "*The*

renewed 1973 form of the Sacrament of Penance has made clear the Trinitarian and ecclesial nature of the Sacrament. In fact, the 1973 Rite of Penance encourages a deeper pastoral reinterpretation of the virtue-sin-conversion polarities. The renewed formula for absolution and the entire rite of the Sacrament reflect more obviously the Church's understanding of the historical evolution of the Sacrament. The new rite has balanced the strengths of the three great eras of penitential development: canonical Penance of the patristic Church, both East and West, the so-called Tariff Penance of the Medieval period, and the Tridentine reform." In previous letters, we reflected on these three periods of development of the Sacrament of Penance in the Church's history. The developments initiated at the Second Vatican Council introduced formulas of greeting of the Penitent, the option to read short passages of Scripture which proclaim the mercy of God, various acts of Contrition which could be prayed by the Penitent, as well as various forms of dismissal of the Penitent. The major update would concern the introductory wording of the prayer of absolution, while the FORM/WORDS OF ABSOLUTION remained unchanged. The new introductory words of the prayer of Absolution would reflect more fully the Trinitarian and ecclesial nature of the Sacrament, rather than the canonical nature of the sacrament.

Prayer of Absolution Prior to Vatican II

May the almighty God have mercy on thee, forgive thee thy sins, and lead thee unto life everlasting. Amen. May the Almighty and merciful Lord grant thee pardon, absolution, and remission of thy sins. Amen. May our Lord, Jesus Christ, absolve thee, and by His very authority do I absolve thee from every bond of excommunication, suspension, and interdict, in so far as lies within my power and thou hast need of it. Furthermore, I ABSOLVE THEE FROM THY SINS IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.



Knights of Columbus Founder's Day is celebrated on March 29 every year. The date commemorates when our founder, Father Michael J. McGivney, was granted the charter from the State of Connecticut to start the fraternal organization. On March 29, 1882, Father McGivney gathered with Catholic men in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven and established the order's first council. The order was created in response to hardships suffered by Catholics, the poor, and immigrants during that time. It has since grown into one of the largest Catholic organizations in the world, with over 16,000 councils and close to 2 million members.

This Founder's Day, members of our Council and their families are participating in a pilgrimage trip to New Haven, Connecticut. We will tour St. Mary's Church and attend a Founder's Day Anniversary Mass, then explore the Blessed Michael McGivney Center with displays and presentations featuring the rich 141-year history of the Knights of Columbus.

RELIGIOUS ED REGISTRATION

If you register before June 1st, the fee is \$60/child and \$100/family (there has been a slight increase in fee due to the rising cost of materials). Late fees apply after June 1st. First Penance takes place in second grade. Confirmation and First Communion take place in third grade with a \$25 sacramental fee. All parents are encouraged to sign their children up for religious education, regardless of whether or not it is a sacrament year for them. How important it is to build that foundation of faith! We have two religious ed groups, and they meet on alternating weeks. Please send in your registrations as soon as possible for the best chance to select the group that is most convenient to your schedule.
