

## **Gospel Meditation**

## **Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

What's your car? Let's say it's a fancy silver Toyota. Now imagine you're having lunch in a restaurant and suddenly see two men outside attempting to steal it. You run outside and confront them. They respond, "The master has need of it." How do you respond? Would you just let them take it, and leave you without a car? I don't think I would.

Yet that is precisely what the owners of the colt on Palm Sunday do. Stunningly, and perhaps a little comically, Jesus instructs two of his disciples to commandeer a colt for him to ride. And when they hear the disciples say, "The master has need of it," they let them take it. Of course, Jesus knew they'd let it go. He gave them the grace to let go of what is rightfully theirs. The result? That colt became perhaps the most famous and important animal ever. The beast plays a role in the redemption of the world.

As Holy Week begins, Jesus perhaps will send people to you to ask for something valuable to you. Perhaps it's your car. More likely it's something like your attention, time, or energy. It's natural to resist at first. We've got things to do, after all. But if the interruption is from Jesus himself, listen to that voice which calmly says, "The master has need of it." And simply let it go. You'll be amazed what the master will do with it.







## KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

Palm Sunday marks the end of Lent and the beginning of Holy Week. A week for reflection on the final week of Jesus' life. Today we celebrate Jesus' triumphant return to Jerusalem. Jesus sent two disciples ahead to locate a donkey. When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on the donkey, the crowds gathered and spread their clothes and palm branches on the ground shouting, 'Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel' (John 12:13). Sadly, the same crowd will later shout, 'Crucify him!'

Making a path of garments and palms was a sign of welcoming royalty, similar to rolling out a red carpet today. Palm branches represent triumph and victory. They were a common symbol of the times. The donkey is a symbol of peace. Jesus rode upon a donkey not only to fulfill the prophecy of Zechariah but in biblical times, it was common for kings to arrive in a procession on a donkey during times of peace. Jesus is reminding us that He is the Prince of Peace. The shouts of Hosanna mean, 'Please, save us.' As a leader, Jesus would be held responsible unless he corrected them. He did not rebuke them. He did come to save. He did save. Just not how they expected.

## **RELIGIOUS ED REGISTRATION**

Religious education registration forms for grades 1-8 for school 2023-2024 available vear online https://www.stkathryns.org/religiouseducationgrades-1-8 and in the back of the church. If you register before June 1st, the fee is \$60/child and \$100/family (there has been a slight increase in fee due to the rising cost of materials). Late fees apply after June 1st. First Penance takes place in second grade. Confirmation and First Communion take place in third grade with a \$25 sacramental fee. All parents are encouraged to sign their children up for religious education, regardless of whether or not it is a sacrament year for them. How important it is to build that foundation of faith! We have two religious ed groups, and they meet on alternating weeks. Please send in your registrations as soon as possible for the best chance to select the group that is most convenient to your schedule.
