





RELIGIOUS ED REGISTRATION

Religious education registration forms for grades 1-8 for school 2023-2024 available online year are at https://www.stkathryns.org/religiouseducationgrades-1-8 and in the back of the church. If you register before June 1st, the fee is \$60/child and \$100/family (there has been a slight increase in fee due to the rising cost of materials). Late fees apply after June 1st. First Penance takes place in second grade. Confirmation and First Communion take place in third grade with a \$25 sacramental fee. All parents are encouraged to sign their children up for religious education, regardless of whether or not it is a sacrament year for them. How important it is to build that foundation of faith! We have two religious ed groups, and they meet on alternating weeks. Please send in your registrations as soon as possible for the best chance to select the group that is most convenient to your schedule.

BAZAAR CRAFT DONATIONS

One of the most eagerly anticipated parts of our Annual Christmas Bazaar and Penny Sale every November is the amazing array of crafts for sale. The team may display a donated craft in a different area of the Bazaar if deemed a better placement (Penny Sale, Basket Room, etc.); donate the item elsewhere at their discretion; and, store or donate items that may be left over after the Bazaar.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

Memorial Day is observed on the last Monday in May. It is one of the two official US holidays honoring the commitment of our military service members. Veterans Day in November honors all those who served, while Memorial Day honors those who lost their lives defending our country. All across America, wreaths and flags will be placed on veterans' graves. Parades and war memorial celebrations will take place. The President will place a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. observances are held at Civil War battle sites, such as Gettysburg, and Antietam. On Memorial Day itself, a national moment of silence takes place at 3 pm local time to remember the war dead. The Honor Guard from Assembly 1506, which includes Knights from Council 5162, will participate in the Memorial Day parade in Nashua. The parade will take place at 10:30 am and will march from Holman Stadium to Elm Street Middle School. Take a moment this weekend to honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country.
