

long bar with bar stools (the kitchen is too narrow for a table)
living room furniture

four tall bureaus (not too wide)
hangers

RELIGIOUS ED REGISTRATION

Religious education registration forms for grades 1-8 for school year 2023-2024 are available https://www.stkathryns.org/religiousat educationgrades-1-8 and in the back of the church. We are now in the very late registration phase, so the registration fee has increased to \$70/child and \$120/family, as late registration allows us less time for planning and obtaining materials. First Penance takes place in second grade. Confirmation and First Communion take place in third grade with a \$25 sacramental fee. All parents are encouraged to sign their children up for religious education, regardless of whether or not it is a sacrament year for them. How important it is to build that foundation of faith! We have two religious ed groups, and they meet on alternating weeks. Please send in your registrations as soon as possible for the best chance to select the group that is most convenient to your schedule.

Several weeks ago, the Holy Spirit led me to research human trafficking for an academic paper. Human trafficking plagues the entire world. It is considered by some to be modern-day slavery and is the most prominent systemic abuse of human rights in the world today. A crisis that has only become worse and harder to combat in this 'culture of silence.'

When I was praying for inspiration for this bulletin, the Holy Spirit presented the entertainment section of a common news feed. The movie, *The Sound of Freedom*, has become the center of controversy as Hollywood elites are trying to blacklist the movie claiming ties to a Q-Anon conspiracy theory. Three unabashedly Catholic actors, Jim Caviezel, Mark Wahlberg, and Mel Gibson are speaking out against the entertainment industry in defense of their faith and their beliefs. We, the Knights of Columbus, have also sworn an oath to defend our Catholic faith. We, meaning all of us, should proudly proclaim our faith and identity as Catholics and deepen our understanding so that we can intelligently defend it.
