MISSION APPEAL



Once a year, as part of the Missionary Cooperative Plan throughout the United States, each parish in the diocese welcomes a member or an associate of a religious community involved in missionary work. On the weekend of September 9-10, 2023 our parish will host a speaker for the Alliance for International Monasticism (AIM USA). We will be joined by Father Aloysius Sarasin, O.S.B., a Benedictine monk and priest of Saint Anselm Abbey in Manchester, NH. He is currently the youngest monk in the monastery by age (and is ready to give that title up to a young man who might have a vocation to the monastic life!). He was ordained a priest on June 18, 2022 and serves as the Assistant Director of Student Engagement and Leadership at Saint Anselm College. Father will be here representing AIM USA, an alliance made up of monasteries across the world and works to foster relationships between monasteries so that resources may be shared to help strengthen developing and first world communities. Monetary funds are pooled and distributed to monasteries in need of assistance building infrastructure and educating monks/nuns. AIM USA has formed an alliance between 140 US and Canadian monasteries with over 450 Benedictine and Cistercian monasteries in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean and Latin America and Eastern Europe. These Benedictine and Cistercian women and men form centers of prayer, education, health and agriculture in some of the poorest regions of the world. Father will share more information with us when he is here. In the meantime, he asks for our prayers for all monastic communities across the globe who pray and work every day in service to God and Holy Mother Church. RELIGIOUS ED REGISTRATION

We are now in the very late registration phase, so the registration fee has increased to \$70/child and \$120/family, as late registration allows us less time for planning and obtaining materials. First Penance takes place in second grade. Confirmation and First Communion take place in third grade with a \$25 sacramental fee. All parents are encouraged to sign their children up for religious education, regardless of whether or not it is a sacrament year for them. How important it is to build that foundation of faith! We have two religious ed groups, and they meet on alternating weeks. 

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

The Perseid meteor shower is one of the best shooting star displays of the year. This year the shower will peak on August 13, and the moon will be waning, providing better viewing. It is estimated that about 100 meteors per hour will be visible. The name Perseid comes from the constellation Perseus, named after the character in Greek mythology. The constellation appears to be a common point of origin for many of the meteors. The Perseid meteor shower also called the "tears of St. Lawrence," is associated with the comet Swift-Tuttle. The comet drops dust and debris in Earth's orbit on its 133-year trip around the Sun. The dust and debris left behind burn up in Earth's atmosphere creating a prolific meteor shower, usually peaking around August 10th, the Feast of Saint Lawrence.

Saint Lawrence was an early Christian martyr who was cooked to death by the Romans on a large outdoor grill. St. Lawrence was martyred on August 10, 258, during the persecutions of the emperor Valerian. After Pope Sixtus II was martyred on August 6, Lawrence became the principal authority of the Roman Church. Lawrence was ordered to bring the wealth of the church when he was summoned by the executioners. He showed up with a handful of crippled, poor, and sick men, stating that they were the true wealth of the Church. He was sentenced to death immediately, being cooked alive on a gridiron. Rumor claims that his last words joked about his manner of execution, stating, "Turn me over, I'm done on this side." Catholics began calling the meteors the "tears of St. Lawrence," even though the celestial event pre-dates the saint.
