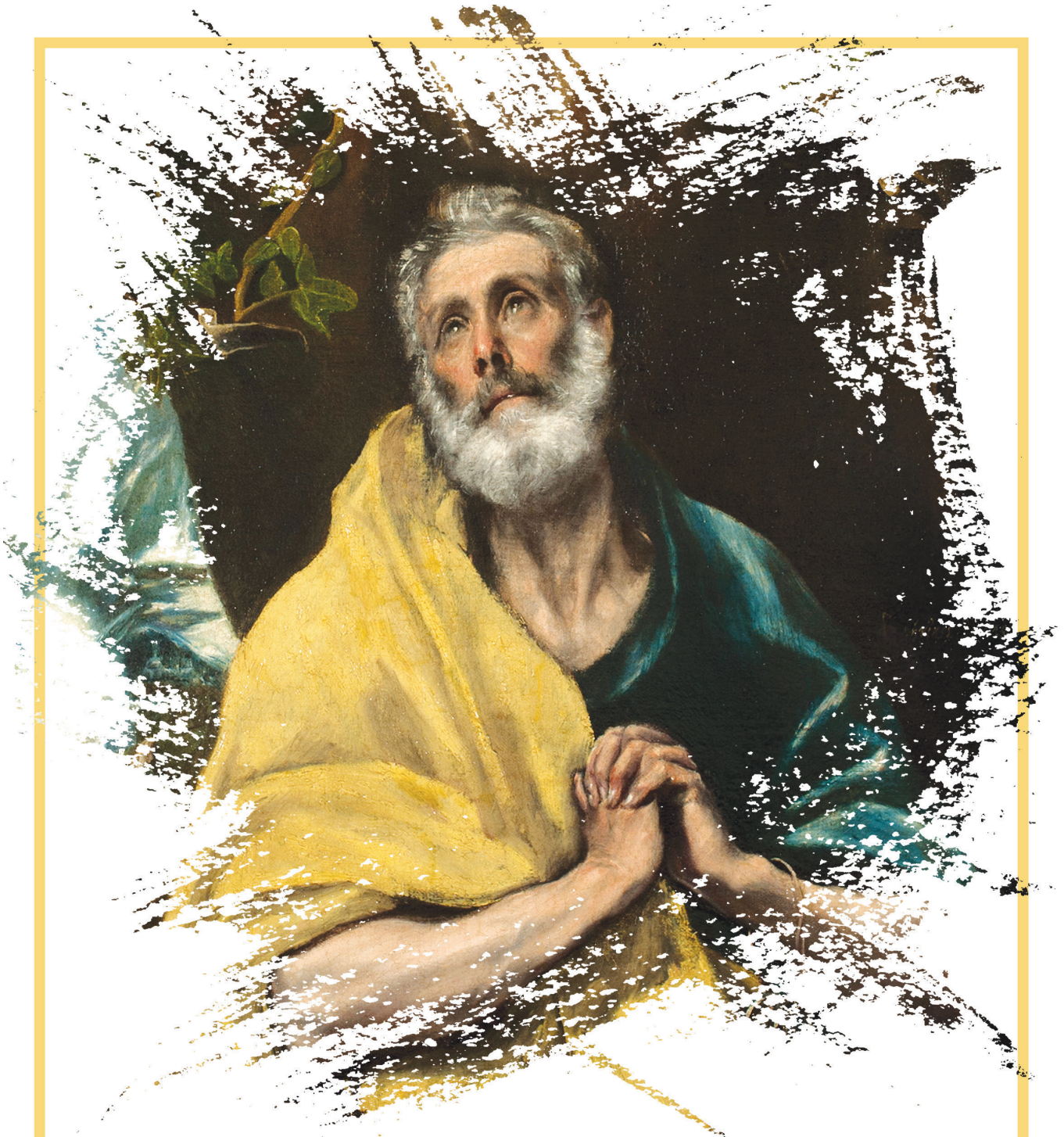

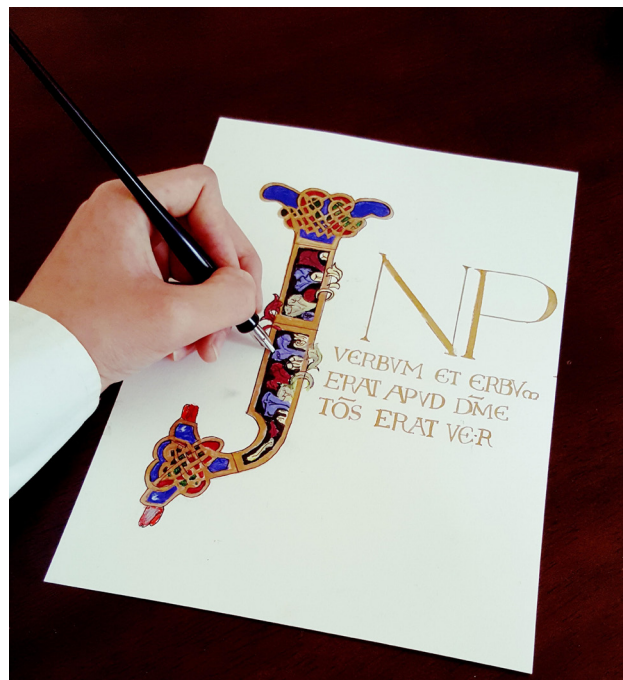

CATECHISTS NEEDED

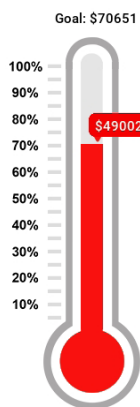

We have two religious ed groups, and they meet on alternating weeks.
