

## **RELIGIOUS ED REGISTRATION**

# **Knights of Columbus**

Can you believe it is October already? October is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily because the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7. The Rosary was given to St. Dominic by the Blessed Virgin Mary herself during an apparition around the year 1221. On October 13, 1917, during her sixth "Miracle of the Sun" apparition in Fatima, Portugal, Mary revealed that "I am the Lady of the Rosary" and urged all the faithful to say the Rosary daily for the salvation of souls.

The Knights of Columbus are dedicated to the devotion to the Rosary. At the exemplification degree, every knight is invested with a rosary and is encouraged to carry it always and pray it as often as possible. The knights of Council 5162 hold a strong devotion to our Queen and Mother.

Our Rosary Program includes daily morning group Rosary prayer, Rosary prayer before every monthly business meeting, and providing rosaries for First Communion youth and the hospital ministries at St. Joseph's Hospital and Catholic Medical Center. We are also creating a large rosary for living Rosary prayers, which will hopefully be completed this month.

Many times, non-Catholics claim that prayers to Mary and the Saints are blasphemy and that all prayers are supposed to go to Jesus. St. James instructs us to "pray for one another." (James 5:16). Just as non-Catholics ask their ministers, elders, family, and friends to pray for them, we pray to Mary and the Saints as intercessors to Jesus. This month, let us consider this beautiful prayer as a means to draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation.




