## **Knights of Columbus**

Last year I wrote about the origins of Halloween or All Hallows Eve and explained the difference between All Saints' Day on November 1 st and All Souls' Day on November 2 nd. Did you know that all three days together are known as the 'Days of the Dead,' a triduum of feasts also known as All Hallowtide? And they are all tied together in the Communion of Saints.

The Communion of Saints is the spiritual solidarity that binds together the living on earth (the Church Militant), the saints in heaven (the Church Triumphant), and all the souls in purgatory (the Church Suffering) in the same mystical body under Christ. These days remind the faithful of the realities of heaven and hell, saints and the damned, angels and demons, and souls suffering in purgatory. Halloween is a day to reflect on Christ's triumph over sin, death, and Satan. A time to reflect on our own mortality and our duties to God. A time to honor the saints in heaven and pray for the souls of the faithfully departed.

Also, the 4:00 PM Mass on November 4 th is dedicated to our Deceased Brother Knights. Brother Knights demonstrate their fraternity in exemplary measure when they pray for the soul of a departed Knight and console the members of his family. 
#### REFLECTING GOD'S GENEROSITY TO OTHERS
