OFFERTORY ENVELOPES

Beginning on January 1, 2024, all offertory envelopes will be mailed to each household for those who have signed up for them and have been actively using them in the past. We will no longer be receiving yearly boxed sets to pick up in Church during the month of December. Instead, the offertory envelopes will be mailed on a bi-monthly schedule. This will make it easier for the parish office to manage the envelopes as well as send out new ones to families who are newly registered. If you have not signed up for envelopes in the past and would like to begin receiving them, please call the parish office or email kimberly.moushegian@stkathryns.org. Those who use online giving can also request envelopes to place in the collection basket at Mass. Just mark on the envelope: "I gave online" and the amount submitted through online giving. If you currently have envelopes, no action is necessary. Your information will be transferred to the new system.

Boxed sets of children's and young people's envelopes will also be available from the parish office for those families who would like to introduce and share the blessing of sacrificial giving with their children. These envelopes will have small teachings about the Faith and the Saints as well as a place for our young people to write down and share some of the good works they have done during the week. FIRST FIRDAY ADOARTION


As one of the ways we are celebrating the Eucharistic Revival during this year of the parish phase is to begin overnight Adoration. Every First Friday of the month, Eucharistic Adoration will be held continuously from First Friday morning 9AM through First Saturday morning 8AM. Adoration on First Fridays will resume being held in the Transept Chapel.

A new keypad lock has been installed near the exterior door of the transept chapel entrance. Thus, on First Fridays, the Church and Transept Chapel will be locked beginning at 6:45PM and will remain locked overnight until 7:00AM Saturday morning. Every adorer for the overnight hours will have a special code to gain access to the chapel for their committed Holy Hour. Those who have not committed to a regular holy hour on First Friday evenings but would like to continue to drop by for some time before the Blessed Sacrament need to contact the evening Coordina-First of Friday Adoration. We would like to encourage everyone to sign up for a committed hour, or as an "on call" substitute so we can continue to grow our time of Adoration.

In the words of St. Alphonsus Liguori, "Of all devotions, that of adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the greatest after the sacraments, the one dearest to God, and the one most helpful to us." May God open the eyes of our hearts to see the great treasure that is Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Knights of Columbus

With a heavy heart, the Knights of Columbus Council 5162 mourns the loss of our brother, Sir Knight Ronald DiStasio (71). Ron passed away unexpectedly at Massachusetts General Hospital on 11/8. He was an active and dedicated member of the Knights of Columbus for 31 years and was an honorary life member of our Council. Ron was our Council Advocate. He was responsible for ensuring that our Council followed the standards of the Knights of Columbus. This was with good reason. Ron was the epitome of what it means to be a Knight. He was a good friend to us all, at the Council, Assembly, and State levels. He will be forever loved and deeply missed. Ron was also our Life Program Director as well as the State Culture of Life Director. He worked tirelessly to promote that every life is sacred from the point of conception to the point of natural death. We will probably never know how many lives he saved through his efforts. I like to picture Ron being greeted in heaven by the multitudes of babies that he prayed for.

Ron is survived by his wife of 47 years, Mary Ann, and his daughter Mary Beth. They meant everything in the world to Ron. His wake was held Wednesday, 11/15, at Rochette Funeral Home. His funeral was held at St. Joseph the Worker Parish on 11/16, followed by his interment at St. Francis Xavier Cemetery. True to Ron, in lieu of flowers, donations to the crisis pregnancy ultrasound program are accepted.


