FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS 2023

Due to the way Christmas falls in the calendar this year, please remember that in the schedule to the left, there are two different schedules of Masses in order to assist us in fulfilling both our Sunday Mass Obligation as well as our Christmas Mass Obligation. The Masses on Saturday evening and Sunday morning fulfill our Sunday Obligation. The Masses on Sunday night and Monday morning fulfill our Christmas Obligation. Thus, even though they are close together, the Church asks us to attend one Mass on the Fourth Sunday of Advent and one Mass on Christmas to fulfill both obligations. Please note that due to the heavy schedule of Masses this year, there is only one Mass on Sunday morning for the Fourth Sunday of Advent. THERE IS NO 10:30AM MASS on Sunday morning.


OFFERTORY ENVELOPES

Beginning on January 1, 2024, all offertory envelopes will be mailed to each household for those who have signed up for them and have been actively using them in the past. We will no longer be receiving yearly boxed sets to pick up in Church during the month of December. Instead, the offertory envelopes will be mailed on a bi-monthly schedule. This will make it easier for the parish office to manage the envelopes as well as send out new ones to families who are newly registered. If you have not signed up for envelopes in the past and would like to begin receiving them, please call the parish office or email kimberly.moushegian@stkathryns.org. Those who use online giving can also request envelopes to place in the collection basket at Mass. Just mark on the envelope: "I gave online" and the amount submitted through online giving. If you currently have envelopes, no action is necessary. Your information will be transferred to the new system.

Boxed sets of children's and young people's envelopes will also be available from the parish office for those families who would like to introduce and share the blessing of sacrificial giving with their children. These envelopes will have small teachings about the Faith and the Saints as well as a place for our young people to write down and share some of the good works they have done during the week. Knights of Columbus

Nobody can say for sure exactly when Jesus was born, but many biblical scholars believe that it probably was not in December. The Romans would not have held their census during winter when travel was especially dangerous. The Gospel of Luke states the shepherds were watching their flock by night. This also would not have taken place during the winter months. In the springtime, sheep give birth to their lambs. Hence, the shepherds would stay out at night with them in case a night birth occurred. But even this is speculation and conjecture as scriptural clues suggest dates all over the calendar. Using biblical clues to calculate the conception of John the Baptist would place the birth of Jesus in the fall.

It was the Emperor Constantine who established Christmas on December 25 th in the year 336. It is believed that the early Church established Christian holidays to counter pagan holidays and festivals. December 25 th in the Julian calendar was the winter solstice and the source of many pagan holidays, including the Roman holidays Sol Invictus and Saturnalia, festivals dedicated to the rebirth and renewed power of the sun.

While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son, and she wrapped Him in cloths, and laid Him in a manger because there was no room for them in the inn. Luke 2: 6-7

Did you know? If Santa's sleigh were loaded with one Beanie Baby for every kid on Earth, it would weigh 333,333 tons. A sleigh weighing that much would require 214,206 reindeer plus Rudolph, to pull it. To deliver his gifts in one night, Santa would have to make 822.6 visits per second, in a sleigh traveling 3,000 times the speed of sound. At that speed, Santa and his reindeer would burst into flame instantaneously.
