Caring for the Gift of the Lord

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am writing to you today to be a part of our parish's Capital Campaign, entitled *Caring for the Gift of the Lord*, which is a four-year initiative to replace and upgrade some of the essential elements of the infrastructure of our parish facilities. St. Kathryn Church and its physical plant has been a great gift from the Lord to so many people, and as our facility ages, we need everyone's help to keep it going!

As many of you know, in the last year, the Buildings and Grounds Committee and I have been working hard to replace the lighting system in our Church, which has been failing over the past several years. After receiving permission from the Bishop to proceed with the project, our lighting system suffered a disastrous malfunction in the operating hardware this past October, which no longer allows control of the lights. Thus, this necessary project has become an urgent need!

However, our capital campaign needs to include other necessary upgrades and replacements, <u>although our lighting system has become our top priority</u>. Attached to this letter is the outline of the various projects which need to be addressed over the next several years; updates about these projects will be made on a regular basis on the Capital Campaign's website, as we move forward. As you know, St. Kathryn Church has been a place of worship which has ministered to so many of us and to the needs of the wider local community over the years, it truly is a **GIFT** from the Lord, worthy of our gratitude, our care, and our financial assistance.

This is why I am writing to all of us today, to ask us to prayerfully consider contributing to this needed work which cannot be accommodated by the ordinary offertory or operating income. The scope, complexity, and cost of these projects really need us to make a planned extra gift during the various phases of our campaign. With your generous help, we will be able to reach our goal, replace our lighting system, and begin working on the other projects which desperately need our attention.

PHASE ONE

Church and Parking Lot Lighting Total Projected Allotment for Phase One \$321,000

Our first and most pressing project is the total replacement of the Church Lighting, which has a **confirmed cost of at least \$241,000.00**, although we need to plan for any unexpected costs that may occur, as always happens with construction, so we are estimating an additional **\$30,000**. Phase One will also address the replacement of the **Parking Lot Lighting**, which has also begun to fail, estimated at **\$50,000**.


UPDATE JANUARY 2024

The lights and materials for the Church lighting are currently being manufactured and we are working with a structural engineer to ensure the structural integrity of the Church floor during the installation process. We have a projected start date of February 2024 with a minimum five week installation time frame.


