
33 Days to Eucharistic Glory

Keep Kids Safe - Talk with your kids

Open communication with your child is a key factor in helping to keep him or her safe. It's important to start talking about safety matters with children from a young age. Let children know that you want them to tell you if anyone touches them in a way that makes them feel uncomfortable or sends them inappropriate messages or pictures. Role play different safetyrelated scenarios to help teach skills such as saying no, telling a trusted adult, and resisting peer pressure.
