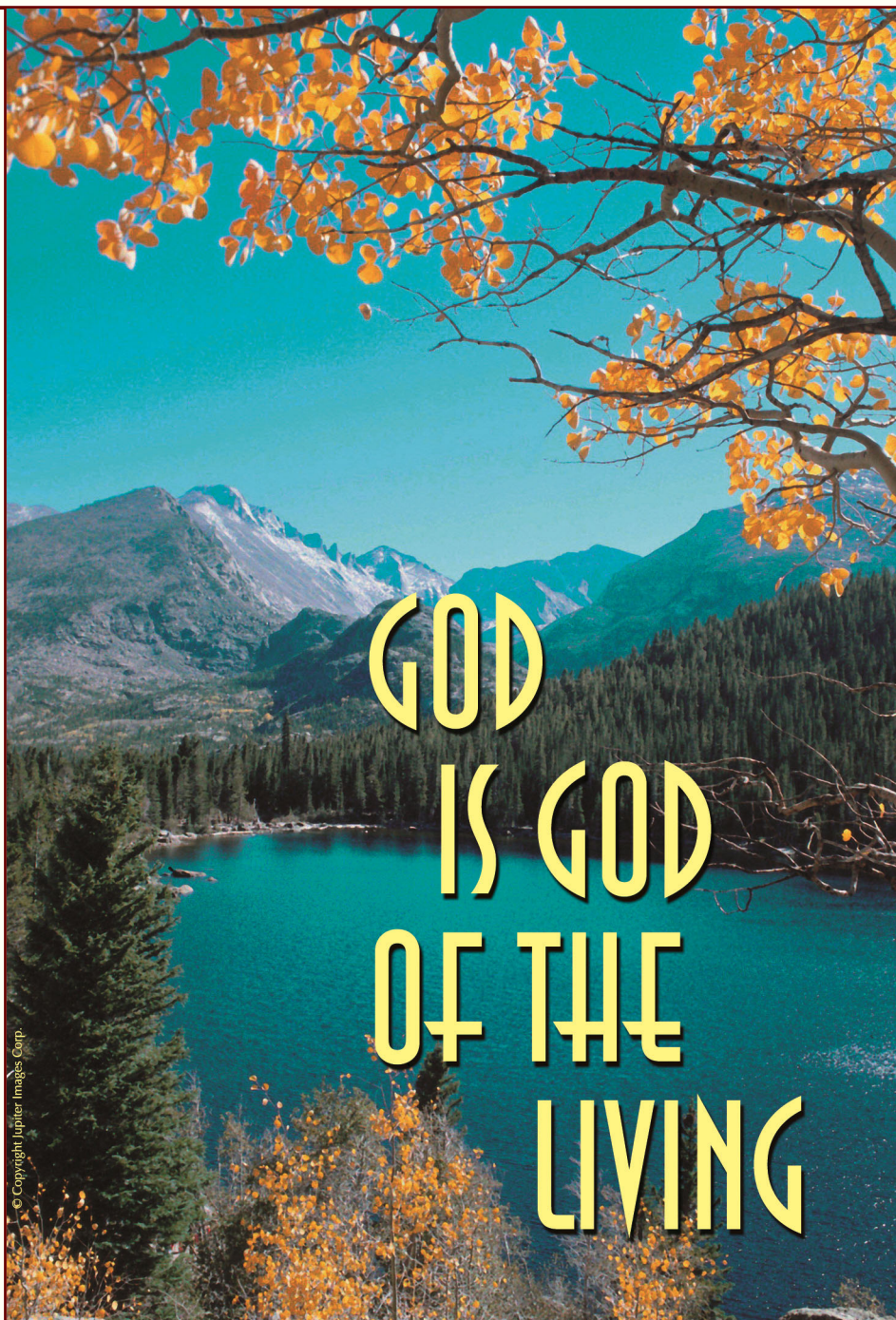

WELCOME RCIA SPONSORS!

This week, we introduce our St. Mary of Vernon Parish sponsors to their seekers. Using a ritual called “The Rite of Friends”, our seekers and sponsors will meet for the first time, get to know each other a little bit, and come together with the catechists in prayer. Our sponsors are individuals from the parish the RCIA team has invited to serve as companion and mentor for their seeker over the remaining months of the RCIA year – from now through Easter and into a season of post-Easter prayer and learning known as Mystagoga.

In addition to our parish sponsors, our inquirers will be able to invite a “personal” sponsor – a Catholic friend or family member who has served as a role model or has been particularly influential in their faith development.

In the weeks ahead, our RCIA group will be getting much more “intimate” with our Scriptures, as we’ll spend three sessions investigating the traditions, roots, and evolution of our understanding of the books of the Old and New Testaments.

Please keep our inquirers, sponsors, catechists, and all who seek to improve their relationship with God through prayer and study in your thoughts and prayers – Thank you!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In the seventeenth century, English Catholics, many of them wealthy and well educated, looked to the American colonies as a place to regain a measure of religious freedom. In Ireland, the so-called penal laws were even harsher than in England, as a minority Parliament tried to force the conversion of the population by denying the majority political and economic power. Beginning in 1691, laws were passed that punished dissenters, principally Catholics, but also causing hardship for Jews, Quakers, and others. There were acts forbidding “mixed marriage” or sending children “beyond the seas” for schooling. Catholics were taxed at double the common rate, barred from the legal professions and from university, and not allowed to build churches or own a decent horse.

In 1793 the situation began to change, as it became clear that the economic persecution would not drive the majority away from Catholicism. Gradually, laws were repealed until by 1829 freedom was won, although Catholics at university were ineligible for honors, and until the 1920s and the Republic, the Church of Ireland was the state church, funded by the taxes of all citizens.

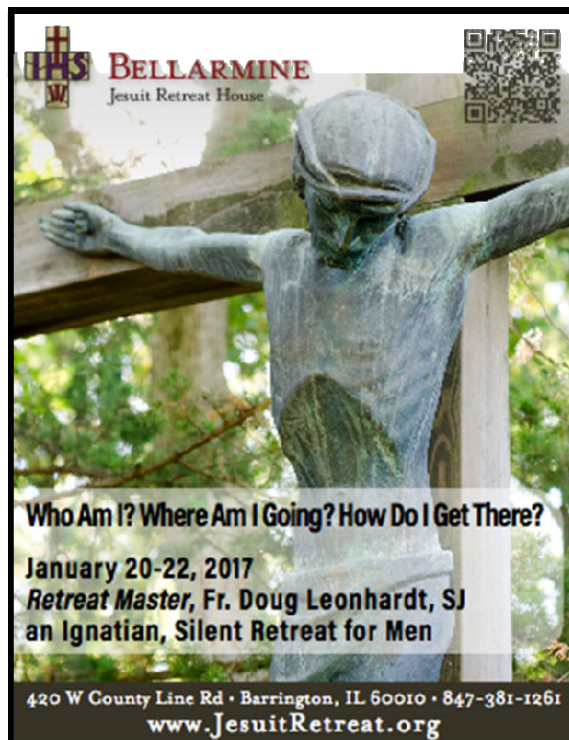

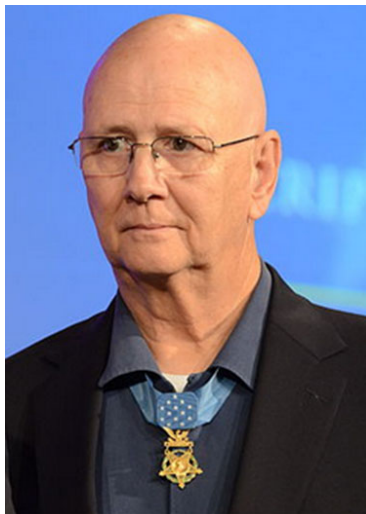

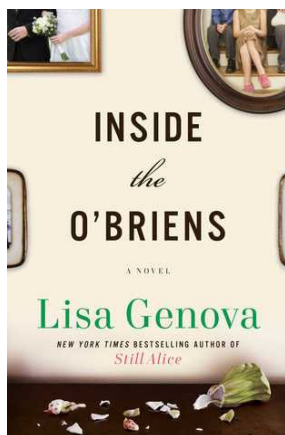

SMV BOOK CLUB



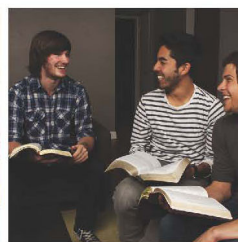
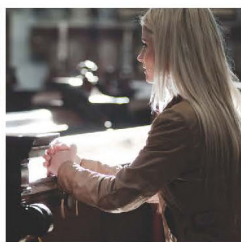
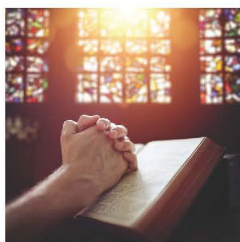

They have all been planted about the grounds of St. Mary of Vernon. They are a wonderful addition to our beautiful landscape!



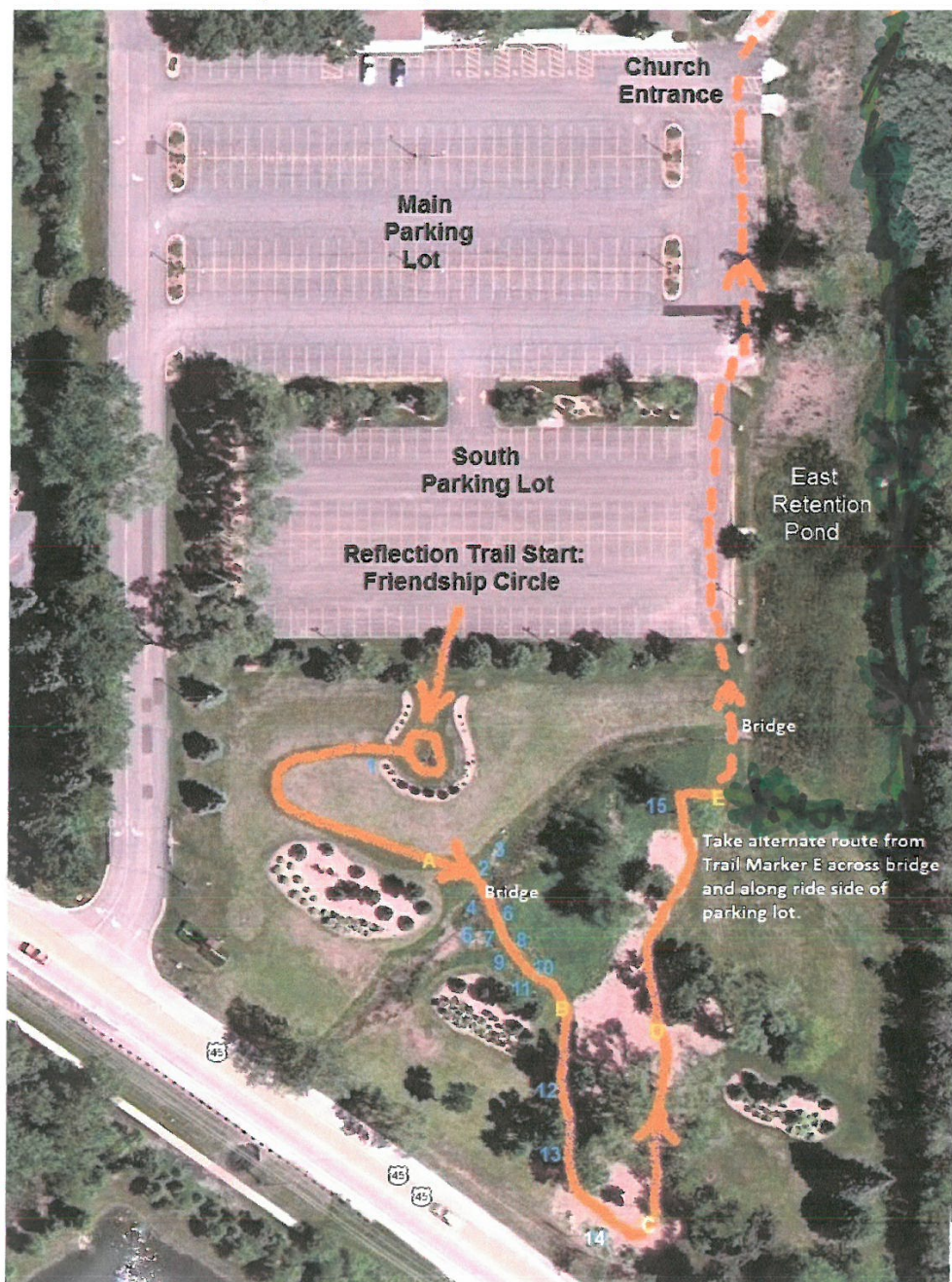
ST. MARY OF VERNON REFLECTION TRAIL

Southern portion

Many people find a healing intimacy with God through quiet meditation and reflection while at church. Here at St. Mary of Vernon, every day we have a unique and wonderful opportunity to become closer to God, even when the church doors are locked. Our Reflection Trail is always open, offering us the chance to stroll through the church grounds and to sit on a bench in silent meditation.

The first portion of the Reflection Trail begins at the "Friendship Circle" behind the south parking lot. Just follow the trail markers. (The trail has been rerouted at marker "E" to follow the right edge of the south parking lot.)

"Meditation is likened to a child who in the presence of a mother says: 'I'll not say a word, if you will just let me stay here and watch you.'" - Bishop Sheen.

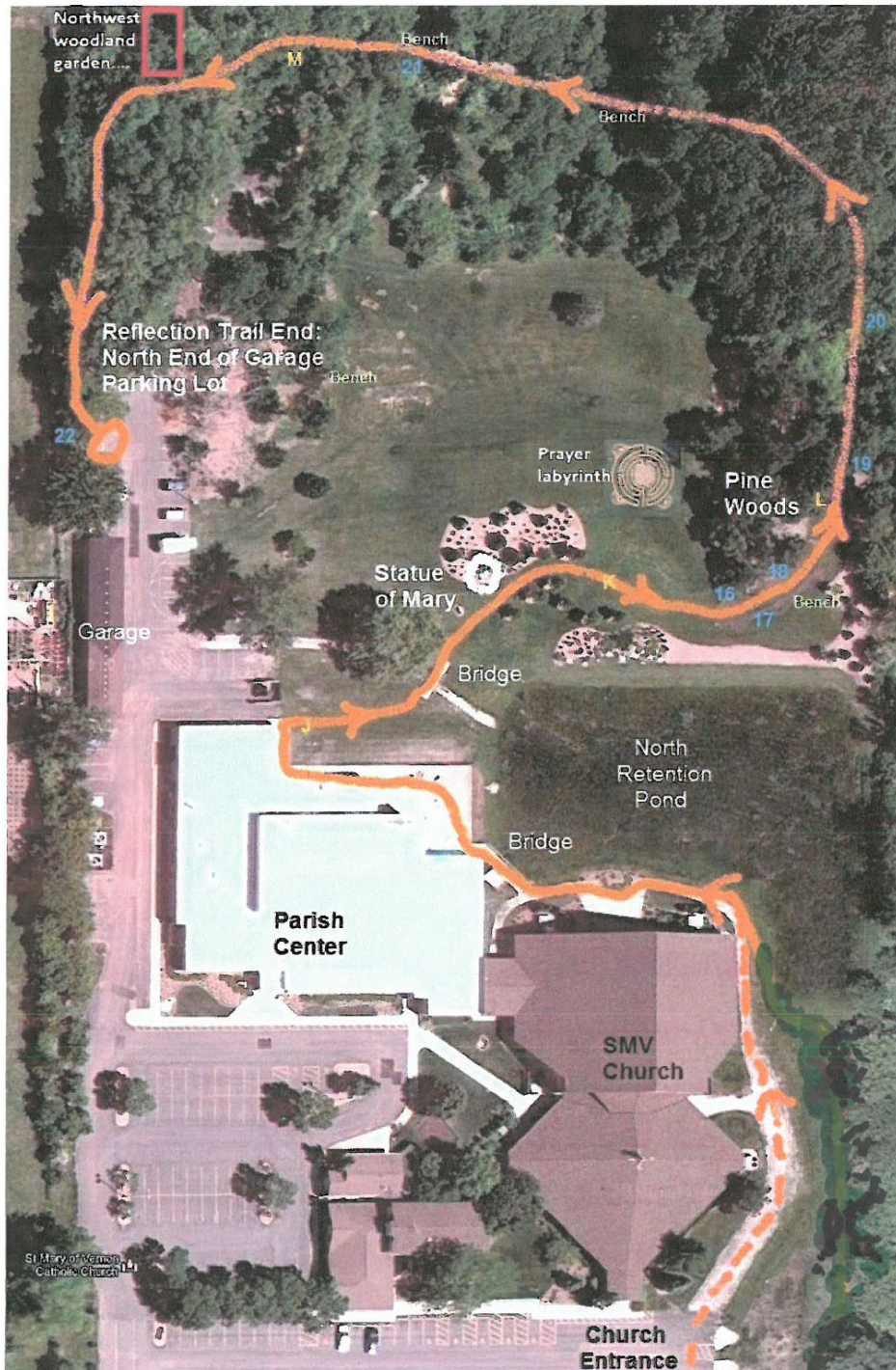

Please note that native plants require conditions in the landscape that mimic their natural habitat. Some of the plants put in next to the plant signs may have died back, found new locations, or were pushed out by invasive weeds. Much effort is needed. Anyone who wishes to help out are most welcome to do so. Just leave your name and phone number at the Parish Office, and you will be contacted about landscaping workdays.

Northern portion

Just to the right of the church entrance, follow the gravel path directly behind the church, cross the bridge, and walk through the patio. Turn right and walk on the grass to the bridge by the Statue of Mary. Continue to follow the trail markers through the Pine Woods and along the northern wooded trail. Note: the Prayer Labyrinth is just north of trail marker K.
