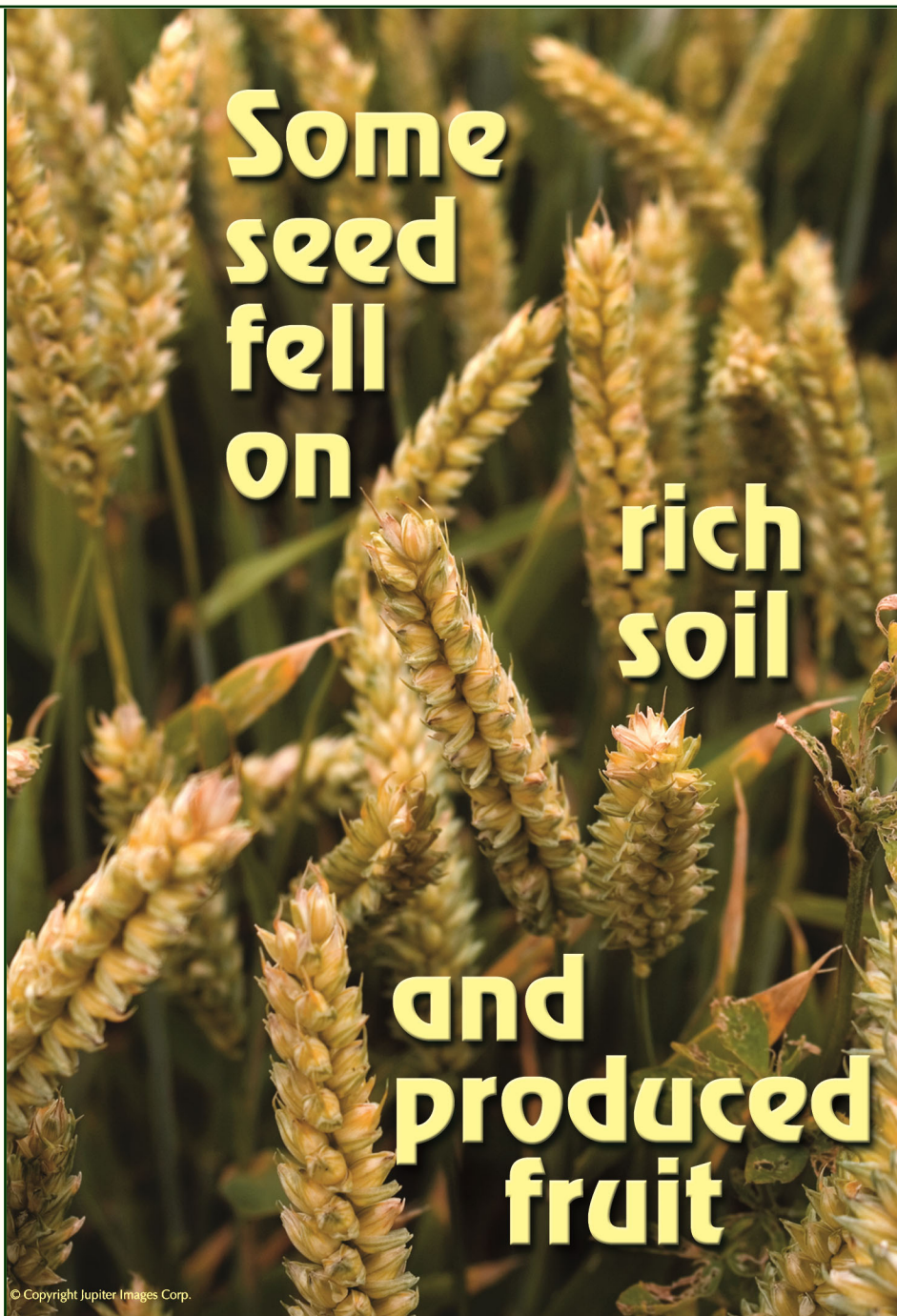

STEWARDSHIP OF OUR FAITH

St. Mary of Vernon serves our surrounding community in a number of outreach programs. We are proudly showcasing **Sharing Hands** this month.

Frank Ruder, the Director of Sharing Hands, graciously describes this ministry. The mission of Sharing Hands is to fulfill our Christian mandate to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and provide shelter for the homeless. We address these issues by providing food, diapers, laundry detergent, clothes, toys, furniture, and school supplies to the needy in our community. The resources required include both financial support and volunteer efforts both of which have been very generously supplied

by our parishioners. On a weekly basis, our team picks up, stores and distributes food, toys and clothes to those who seek our help. We also provide Spanish translation when needed, and play with children while their parents are being served.

Maria Orozco was initially attracted to St. Mary of Vernon because she witnessed the commitment of the church and parishioners to “make the world a better place”. Maria wanted to participate in Sharing Hands after she volunteered to collect food for Thanksgiving meals. She initially served as an interpreter and her role continues to grow. Maria finds it to be both humbling and a privilege to serve with this ministry.

Tom and Kathie Klein relocated to St. Mary of Vernon after experiencing a sense of belonging and camaraderie at our parish. Prompted by retirement, Tom was seeking the best use of his time, talent, and treasure. Sharing Hands fulfilled that desire. Tom and Kathie feel blessed for the opportunity and ability to serve.

Luke taught the early Church that the members of the Church had a responsibility to ensure that everyone’s basic needs were met. Sharing Hands continues to make the “good news” of our faith live in our congregation and community.

HELP WANTED!

Do you enjoy meeting new people? Looking to get involved in the parish but don’t have a lot of time? Here are three opportunities that involve a minimal time commitment and in which we have a great need for additional volunteers:

- 1) **Greeters before and after Mass.** Welcome people at the doors, help newcomers become acquainted with the parish, thank people for coming after Mass. Greeters typically serve 1-3 times a month as their schedule allows. Training is required and can be arranged to fit your schedule.
- 2) **Hospitality once a month after Mass.** Serve coffee and food after Mass, assist with cleanup. Hospitality ministers are trained on the job and may serve monthly or every other month as their schedule allows.
- 3) **Parish Library Table volunteers once a month after Mass,** typically on the same week as Hospitality. Assist people in checking out and returning good spiritual reading material.

Furniture Help Needed

As most of you know, we operate a furniture ministry as part of our Sharing Hands outreach to the poor. Every Saturday morning we put 5 teams of adult drivers, augmented with teen and adult helpers, on the road in our Sharing Hands vehicles (2 trucks, 2 mini-vans and a pick-up truck) to pick up donations from donors and deliver that furniture to families in need. It is a most gratifying ministry that leaves the volunteer with a sense of satisfaction that he/she has affected the quality of life of those they serve.

We are currently experiencing a shortage of volunteers and need your help to keep the ministry thriving. Consider:

- If you are a **student who needs service hours** for a school requirement such as NHS or various other programs, this is a great way to do it.
- If you **attend Carmel** and would like to put the coming year's campus ministry requirement behind you, why not bank hours in the summer thereby relieving yourself of the pressure during the school year.
- If you are the **Dad or Mom** of a teen, how about joining your son or daughter on Saturday morning for a bonding experience that teaches social responsibility to your offspring.
- If you are an **adult or teen** who owes the court system some hours, perhaps you'd be able to cover those in this way. Confidentiality protected.
- If you are an **adult or teen** who feels blessed in the life God has provided for you, what better way to say thanks than to follow his command to serve the least of your brothers and sisters.
- Maybe you'd like to model the Christian life for your kids and let them see Dad or Mom in action helping others.

You needn't be muscle bound; many hands make light work. You are encouraged to bring a friend. Most of our drivers work a single three hour Saturday morning per month; other crew members work as often as they want. The frequency is up to you. If you can help, call Jim at 847-726-1980.

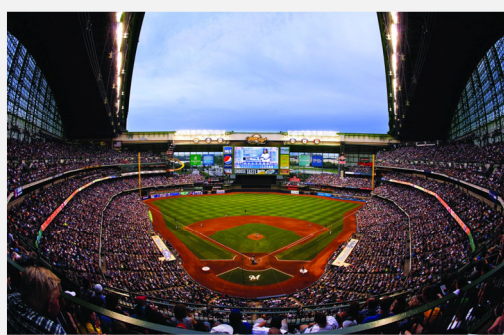

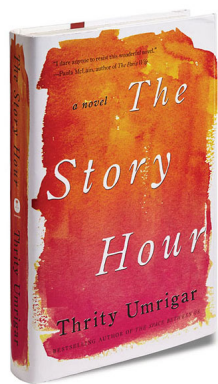

SMV BOOK CLUB



The Story Hour by Thrity Umrigar is the selection for the **July 20** SMV book club discussion in the **Parish Center, room 118 at 11:30 am**. This author recently spoke about this book when she was hosted by area libraries for a One Book One Community event.

Dr. Maggie Bose is about to leave her office for the evening when she gets a call about a patient who has been admitted after a suicide attempt... Not knowing what to expect, she finds a quiet, scared person who refuses to directly answer her questions --- or believe anything she says --- yet seems in control. After leaving the hospital, Maggie finds that the woman, an Indian immigrant named Lakshmi Patil, affected her more than she let on but can't figure out why.

Lakshmi, caught up in a bad marriage and convinced by her husband that she isn't worth much, is trying to figure out who she is and where she belongs. Having spent her life caring for and fixing the problems of others, she finds herself aimless, unable to fix her own life and almost unwilling to ask for help for herself. She spends her days working at her husband's grocery store and restaurant. Between belittling comments, she begins to realize just how little she matters to him.

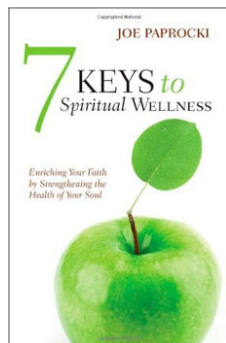
Maggie, a therapist known in her small community for her unorthodox methods, finds a way to reach Lakshmi. She decides that Lakshmi isn't a danger to herself but sees that she needs someone to talk to and help her understand and come to terms with her situation. Maggie takes a shot and decides to treat Lakshmi free of charge as long as she will come to her private practice at her home. The once-a-week meetings begin, and both women find that they look forward to the sessions.

What Maggie comes to understand is that Lakshmi doesn't so much talk as tell stories, which is how they come to know each other. They dance around issues, hiding their problems, but somewhere along the way end up friends. Maggie encourages Lakshmi to open her own catering business, and Lakshmi begins to help Maggie appreciate her husband, Sudhir. Sudhir, an Indian as well, gives Maggie insight to understanding Lakshmi, while Lakshmi provides reverse insight for Maggie, who is having doubts about her very organized and what she perceives to be a very boring life with Sudhir.

In the end, both ladies find that they are stronger and, in some ways, weaker than they ever imagined, and that's what I truly loved about THE STORY HOUR. Maggie and Lakshmi are harboring painful truths that have changed and will change the course of their lives. Both face prejudices --- Maggie as an African-American, and Lakshmi as an Indian immigrant --- which has affected the way they live their lives and identify themselves. As their friendship grows, they start to see the world differently. They reveal truths about themselves, some very hurtful, but come to see how much life really has to offer.

Not only is the writing lovely, the characters are so very real. They hurt, they harm, they love and they live. They survive in spite of themselves. It is an all-absorbing story. Maggie and Lakshmi need each other but don't quite know it. What they find in their friendship is understanding and forgiveness, which they both desperately need...*Bookreporter*

VERNON HILLS BEHAVIORAL HOSPITAL CONTINUES TO NEED YOUR SUPPORT
JULY 18TH MEETING POSTPONED



U.S. HealthVest continues to negotiate with Vernon Hills over several zoning issues for their Behavioral Hospital. Their presentation on July 18th before the Vernon Hills Village Board in a Meeting of the Whole has been postponed until those issues are resolved. We will keep you informed once a new meeting date is scheduled.

We are actively communicating with all of the concerned participants. We continue to support US HealthVest's proposal. We have sought and received answers to all of our questions and concerns about their proposal. US HealthVest hospitals provide specialized psychiatric care to patients with a full range of inpatient and day hospital services for children, adolescents, adults and senior adults. They have a strong commitment to providing quality care to all patients, regardless of ability to pay. <http://www.ushealthvest.com>

Lake County does not have a hospital dedicated full time to behavioral health. Patients with mental health issues are seen and quickly released from Lake County hospital emergency rooms. In 2014 Lake County United in partnership with the Lake County Health Department surveyed 1,759 Lake County residents from throughout the county to get feedback on residents health and access to health care options. 43.5% mentioned dealing with depression or anxiety and 37.1% indicated that they had no access to mental health services. Lake County United then surveyed the state of welfare and healthcare in Lake County. The biggest issue was the need to divert persons with mental health issues away from the care of the criminal justice system to community based treatment. <http://www.lakecountyunited.org/health>

St. Mary of Vernon is a member of Lake County United and together we are working to bring this issue out of the shadows and to assure there are appropriate, humane services available to treat mental illness. Lake County United's member organizations commit both dues and leaders (based on their size) to work for a just society through active citizenship. Consider joining St. Mary of Vernon's Lake County United Committee.
