

#### ST. JOSEPHINE BAKHITA

#### Feast Day - February 8

Born around 1869, Saint Josephine Margaret Bakhita was the niece of a tribal chief. She grew up happy and prosperous, as she said, not knowing suffering. When she was seven, all of that changed. She was kidnapped by Arab slave traders and forced to walk over 600 miles to the slave market. Over the next twelve years, she was sold twelve times. Most often, owners would beat her, sometimes daily.

Finally, she was sold to the Italian Vice Council, Callisto Legani, who treated her kindly and from time to time, would place her in the custody of the Canossian Daughters of Charity. While there, she came to learn of God and Christ. Eventually, she refused to leave and her owner took the case to court. The court determined that because slavery had been outlawed in Sudan since before she was born, Bakhita was not lawfully a slave.

Suddenly, she was free and decided to stay with the Canossian Sisters. She was baptized on January 9, 1890. She took her final vows in 1896 and spent the next 42 years working as a cook and doorkeeper at the convent; she would also go to other convents telling her story and preparing them for work in Africa. Amazingly, she would speak kindly of her kidnappers. If she had not been kidnapped, she might never have come to know Christ and his church. She died on February 8, 1947, her last words being, "Our Lady, our Lady!" She was canonized by Pope Saint John Paul II in 2000. She is the patron saint of Sudan.

#### ASH WEDNESDAY ANNOUNCEMENT

This year, the largely secular celebration of Valentine's Day (February 14) coincides with Ash Wednesday and some have inquired if a dispensation from the obligations to fast and abstain from meat will be given.

Catholics throughout the world recognize Ash Wednesday as the solemn beginning of a period of prayerful reflection and penance, as is evident by the large number of church goers on this day.

In view of the significance of Ash Wednesday the obligation of fast and abstinence must naturally be the priority in the Catholic community. Valentine's Day can appropriately be celebrated the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, which also happens to be Mardi Gras, a traditionally festive time before beginning our Lenten observance.

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We're reading St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians these days. What was Corinth like? It had a beautiful setting on an isthmus, about fifty miles from Athens. The location makes for very easy exchange by sea routes between Greece and Italy, a factor in its economic success even today. In Paul's day it was a cosmopolitan and wealthy city with inhabitants drawn from all over the world, including a sizeable Jewish community. When Paul arrived about the year 50, the city was only about a century old, but already five times the size of Athens. Paul lived in Corinth for a year and a half, and a few years later came back for three months. The community of Christians there struggled against the influence of a very secular and self-indulgent society that was blind to the plight of the poor. Pagan attitudes afflicted the community, which had a way of breaking Paul's heart; he wrote to them sometimes "with many tears" (2 Corinthians 2:4).

Today, Corinth is a small industrial city. Its historic core has been destroyed by a series of earthquakes over the centuries, and what little remained was totally obliterated in a war with Turkey in the 1820s. There's a core city with glamorous shops to catch the tourists, but it is mainly a cargo port, with piles of marble, tiles, and minerals everywhere, a huge oil refinery nearby, a busy canal, a modern fast rail line to Athens, and a meeting point of major highways. Today, the remains of the Temple of Apollo and the marketplace are more ruined than most such sites. The glory of the city Paul knew well has faded, but the relevance of his words shines through the centuries.


#### **Confirmation 2018**

#### TIRELESS DISCIPLESHIP

The stories we've been hearing these weeks come from the very first chapter of Mark, and they show us the public ministry of Jesus in its infancy. Today's account shows some of the strain or adjustment of his new life of preaching the reign of God, healing the sick, and casting out demons. Notice that after sunset, when darkness ended the workday, people brought the sick and possessed to Jesus. The following day he rose before dawn to get away by himself to pray, but to no avail. Simon Peter and the others don't just look for him, they pursue him, filled with the fervor that his ministry has incited. With the self-sacrificing example he gave until the end of his earthly life, he tells his followers that this is his whole purpose. Through Mark, he is also telling the early church, and he is telling us, that this is our purpose, our vocation: to be tireless in our pursuit of proclaiming the Good News, and in bringing the healing, reconciling touch of Christ to the world.



- Do a pre-game prep review the role description and required skills
- Prepare a list of questions that you want to ask about the position and the company.
- Dress as if it's in-person

- Turn off other phones and mute the speakers on your computer.
- Lay out a copy of your resume and the job description you'll refer to these often
- Have pen and paper handy to take notes



#### FREE WINTER PRUNING TRAINING AT ST. MARY OF VERNON

Monday, February 19, weather permitting, or Tuesday, February 20 as an alternative, Ron and Tracey Lester of Architerra are donating four trained landscape technicians for seven hours of pruning, from 7:00 am to 2:30 pm, at Saint Mary of Vernon.

Ron and Tracey are Saint Mary of Vernon parishioners. Architerra is their landscape company that helps to maintain our beautiful parish grounds.

Saint Mary of Vernon parishioners are encouraged to participate with the Architerra technicians to learn how to properly prune plant material during its dormant state.



#### What is dormant pruning?

**Dormant pruning** is a process performed at the end of the growing season prior to or during the dormant phase sometime before the unfurling of flowers and foliage in early spring. Performing dormant pruning directly improves plant health by removing dead, injured, rotting disease and /or insect infested wood. Ornamentals and shrubs are pruned back and thinned to rejuvenate new growth at the base of the plant, and to eliminate witches broom allowing the plant to be brought back to landscape size improving plant health, appearance, and fruitfulness.

#### SMV 2017 CHRISTMAS TREE LOT FINAL UPDATE

This year's St. Mary of Vernon Christmas Tree Sale was very successful! Thank you to all SMV parishioners who purchased Christmas trees and wreaths.

Overall our gross earnings were \$10,612.13. Subtracting the new LED Christmas lights, \$219.56; polypropylene twine, the 195 Christmas trees and 10 Christmas wreaths at a cost of \$5,342.25; and the \$814.10 for gasoline, and Ryder box truck rental, driven by Ron Lester, we have a profit of \$4,200.00.

A special thank you goes to Ron Lester's fellow Scout and Carmel High School classmate, Michael Belmont, who upon seeing Ron's Facebook post came on December 23 and generously bought out the remaining 24 Christmas trees with a donation of \$800!

\$3,000 of our profit will go to our Alpha Omega teens. Nine teens earned \$20 per hour totaling \$1,030. The remaining \$1,970 will go to support Alpha Omega. \$1,200 will go to support the parish Scouts.
