

THIS WEEK IN THE RCIA – UNDERSTANDING THE TRIDUUM

In our final week of preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation, we will look into the meaning of Holy Week and, in particular, the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday/Easter). Our discussion will center on the theology behind these most sacred days of the year and how we celebrate the basics of our faith in and through these Liturgies.

Did you know that the three days of the Triduum are considered one celebration? We gather as a community of faith on Thursday evening to begin re-membering ourselves to the life, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ; we are not formally dismissed from that celebration until the end of the Easter Vigil on Saturday night! Each of the three Liturgies binds our lives to the life of Jesus – in a historical sense but also in the real experience of receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus; we are bound together with Jesus through and for all time as we recognize the living presence of the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist and in one another.

Please keep our entire group in your prayers this most Holy Week – Cindy (our Elect who is readying herself to enter into the Church through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil), Antoni (currently preparing for reception into the Church), their sponsors and the entire RCIA team. Also, we invite you to pray for all Elect and Candidates around the world and for those participating in a journey of faith as inquirers. Our best wishes to all for a most Holy and wonderful celebration of this week and the Triduum; you are all being remembered in the prayers of our RCIA participants.

If you or someone you know would like to learn more about the Catholic Faith and the community of St. Mary of Vernon – and how our church might help you discover God in new ways – the SMV RCIA is ready and willing to help! 

PASSION

The contrast between the processional reading in today's liturgy and the proclamation of the Passion is striking. We are given a glimpse of how profoundly the word of God is fulfilled in Jesus.

First he must be hailed as the Messiah, the One who is to come. He must be acknowledged by all, though they do not know what they are saying. They think he is the promised king, a worldly king of the Jews who will free them from the Roman occupation. They do not yet understand, even the disciples, exactly where this triumphal procession is leading. In our lives, we too do not know where we are going. It is in faith that we can follow Christ wherever he may lead us, trusting that death is not the end, nor evil the victor.


