


## Eucharistic Adoration THURSDAY ~ MAY 3<sup>rd</sup>

## Fr. Bill Zavaski Call to Discipleship & Developing a Personal Relationship with Jesus

Sunday Weekend Masses—May 5th & 6th Fr. Bill - homilist at all Masses

#### Sunday Evening, May 6th at 7 PM:

Major characteristics of discipleship as found in the early Christian communities.

Fr. Bill Zavaski, a classmate of Fr. Joe Curtis, was born in Waukegan, Illinois in 1943. He attended St. Bartholomew grammar school, Quigley Preparatory Seminary High School, Niles College, and St. Mary of the Lake Seminary and was ordained on May 14,1969.

His various assignments included (1) St. James, Arlington Heights - 1969-76; (2) St. Zachary, Des Plaines - 1976-79; (3) his home parish as pastor at St. Bartholomew's - 1979-90. (also Dean in Lake County in 1985.) (4)Transfiguration Parish as pastor in Wauconda - 1990-95; and (5) back to St. James, Arlington Heights as pastor from 1995 to 2015. Fr. Bill is now pastor emeritus. During the course of this last assignment he was appointed Dean of the Northwest suburbs in 1999 and remained Dean until 2007.

Since his time in Wauconda he has been conducting parish missions in parishes throughout the archdiocese and giving talks on a variety of topics as well. Fr. Bill puts it this way: "I am just a simple parish priest with no special degrees but plenty of pastoral experience." Fr. Bill knows what it means to be among the People of God and he feels so blessed to find the Lord Jesus alive and well within each parish community.

## PERHAPS THE SPIRIT IS CALLING YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW TO BE A <u>PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL</u> (PPC) MEMBER?

St. Mary of Vernon Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) exercises shared responsibility for the pastoral life of the parish under the leadership of the pastor. The council engages the people and pastor in common reflection upon the parish's mission and ministry and is presently developing our parish priorities for the next five years and a plan to move us towards accomplishing these priorities.

Our Parish Council is made up of 12 members of the parish. At this time 5 new members are being sought. Having a variety of ages, experiences, length of time as parishioner, cultural and ethnic backgrounds helps us reflect the diversity of our parish community as a whole.

#### General Qualities of a PPC Member include . . .

- ...an openness to persons, opinions, and a variety of ways of looking at church and parish life.
- ...a broad vision of church in keeping with Vatican Council II
- ...an ability to make a commitment of time and involvement
- ...an ability to provide an "at-large" type of representation, keeping the whole parish in mind in discussions and reflection.
- ...a practicing Catholic who is a registered member of SMV Parish.
- ...sincerely interested in working for the overall good of SMV Parish.
- ...an ability to work well with others, always desiring to build a spirit of unity in diversity.

#### Usual Time and Involvement anticipates . . .

- ...a willingness to attend a Saturday orientation session with all parish council members, and other mutually decided upon learning and enrichment sessions.
- ...attendance at and participation in our monthly PPC meetings.
- ...a willingness to act as liaison with other council members at regular monthly meetings of one of our four commissions.
- ...a willingness to prepare for council meetings by reading necessary material, reflecting and praying for the parish and the council, and doing what would be helpful for the projects of our parish council.
- ...a commitment to a three-year term on the council.

The discernment process takes place on May 5th from 8:30 Mass until around noon. Through facilitated prayer and discussion, those who stepped forward with an openness to the possibility of serving on the PPC discern among themselves who is called to be on the council for the next term.




#### ST. CATHERINE OF SIENNA 1347 – 1380

Feast Day: April 29

St. Catherine was a member of a very large family, and had religious aspirations from a very young age. Before she was sixteen, she cut her own hair to protest her mother's insistence that she must think of her appearance to attract a husband. She declared that she would be a bride only of Christ. Her father acquiesced to her wishes and set aside a small room in the house in which she could study and pray. She spent nearly three years in virtual solitude until she had a revelation from the Lord that she should serve the poor and infirm.

She joined the Dominican Third Order and served the sick. Word of her religiosity spread throughout Italy. Though not desiring it, a group of followers congregated around her, and to encourage them, she wrote nearly four hundred letters of spiritual, political and practical nature. She corresponded with kings, princes and even popes as well as local nuns, priests, merchants and farmers. Her major work, "The Dialogue" was a collection of conversations between God and Catherine herself regarding the spiritual life of Man and description of Heaven, Hell and Purgatory. She also wrote down many of her personal prayers that she felt would be enlightening to others. She was canonized in 1461 by Pope Pius II, and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Paul VI is 1970. She is a patron of Europe, Italy, nurses and the ill.




