

RCIA – THE SACRAMENTS (CONTINUED): ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Slight change in the schedule...our session on Reconciliation was rescheduled for this coming Wednesday. Last week, we covered the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:

The Catechism of the Catholic Church's section on the Anointing of the Sick defines the purpose of the sacrament as "the conferral of a special grace on the Christian experiencing the difficulties inherent in the condition of grave illness or old age." (*Catechism*, 1527)

In his Gospel St. Mark (6:12-13) gives us an indication of this sacrament of the sick when he tells us that the apostles, going forth, "preached that men should repent, and they cast out many devils, and anointed with oil many sick people, and healed them." However, the classical description which the Bible gives of the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is found in the Epistle of St. James:

Is any one among you sick? Let him bring in the presbyters [priests] of the Church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up, and if he be in sins, they shall be forgiven him. (James 5:14-15)

Who does the Church invite to be anointed? Certainly any individual who is suffering from any serious illness, but there are other circumstances which can be considered. (If you're not sure if you should ask to receive the Sacrament – ask!) For example:

- A sick person may be anointed before surgery, whether or not a serious illness is the reason for the surgery.
- Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present.
- Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this sacrament.

The RCIA team invites all our parishioners and guests to continue praying for our candidates – Lindley and Tracey – and our seekers – Emma and Hannah – and our sponsors, teams of catechists, our neighbors who are being called back to the Church, and all those who are seeking to better understand their relationship with God.

TAIZÉ PRAYER: JANUARY 31st at 7 P.M. ALL ARE WELCOME!

Thursdays have been designated as our Parish Day of Prayer. Since January 31st is the 5th Thursday of the month, we will have a Taizé prayer service here at St. Mary of Vernon at 7 p.m.

Taizé is a meditative common prayer that includes repetitive singing, Scripture, silent meditation, lit candles, dim lights and prayers of petition. The service is about contemplation and being in touch with God. The repetitive songs are simple and prayerful. Silence is also an important part of the Taizé service. It is in the silence that we hear God speak and invite the Holy Spirit to pray in us.

Taizé prayer originated in Taizé, France by a monk named Brother Roger who gathered around him men of different Christian denominations to come together for worship. It has since become a world-wide ecumenical movement. Its peaceful, contemplative nature has drawn millions from all over the world to practice this kind of worship.

There are very few 5th Thursdays in the year so you are invited to take this rare opportunity to experience this type of prayer. Join us for a calm, quiet and welcome respite from the busyness of the day. 



ALTAR SERVER APPRECIATION MASS SMV AND ALL OF VICARIATE 1



Job Seeking Goals for the New Year: Goal #1 - Update your resume and LinkedIn profile

You can probably think of a million things you'd rather be doing than [writing a resume](#). But you'll do yourself a favor if you have an up-to-date document at your fingertips. One mistake people frequently make is to wait to revise their resume until they find a job that interests them. That prevents them from applying for the position right away. And by the time they have an updated version ready to submit, it may be too late. So, don't delay.

While you're at it, review your LinkedIn profile and make sure it reflects your most recent professional accomplishments. Your profile is essentially your online resume, and many employers search for candidates on LinkedIn as part of their recruiting efforts. You want your profile to reflect the same information as your traditional resume.

Another advantage of having a polished LinkedIn profile? Recruiters often use LinkedIn to help identify passive job seekers. If you maintain a solid online profile, you'll increase the likelihood that a recruiter will take a closer look at you.
