TAIZÉ PRAYER: MAY 30th AT 7 P.M. ALL ARE WELCOME!

Thursdays have been designated as our Parish Day of Prayer. Since May 30th is the 5th Thursday of the month, we will have a Taizé prayer service here at St. Mary of Vernon at 7 p.m.

Taizé is a meditative common prayer that includes repetitive singing, Scripture, silent meditation, lit candles, dim lights and prayers of petition. The service is about contemplation and being in touch with God. The repetitive songs are simple and prayerful. Silence is also an important part of the Taizé service. It is in the silence that we hear God speak and invite the Holy Spirit to pray in us.

Taizé prayer was originated in Taizé, France by a monk named Brother Roger who gathered around him men of different Christian denominations to come together for worship. It has since become a world-wide ecumenical movement. Its peaceful, contemplative nature has drawn millions from all over the world to practice this kind of worship.

There are very few 5th Thursdays in the year so you are invited to take this rare opportunity to experience this type of prayer. Join us for a calm, quiet and welcome respite from the busyness of the day. RCIA – OUR SACRAMENTAL JOURNEY

Our RCIA Cathechumen and Candidate have been working their way through an investigation of the Sacraments. Current topics are the Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. In coming weeks, the group will continue to explore the meaning of the Sacraments, why the Catholic Church celebrates seven Sacraments (while many of our fellow Christians only celebrate two Sacraments), and the role of the Sacraments in the life of the Church. Future sessions will see the group investigating the theology behind each of the Sacraments, and will discuss what each of the Sacraments says about who we are and what we believe as Catholics. The symbols and rituals associated with the celebration of the Sacraments will also be explored.

Have you invited those people in your life who are searching for a better relationship with God - by your words and/or actions - into a deeper conversation with God? Now would be a magnificent time to reach out and invite them into that conversation!





THE GIFT OF PEACE

"There arose no little dissension and debate." Did that happen at work this week? Most of us can recall run-ins with coworkers, even with the boss. Did it happen while socializing with friends? Go easy on politics, religion . . . even sports. At home? Even the most peaceful household experiences a little "give and take" now and then. So where was it that "there arose no little dissension and debate"? That tumultuous conflict occurred among our first Christian ancestors, disrupting the community life of the early church. But today's Acts of the Apostles shows how beautifully the Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus in today's Gospel, helped the church achieve a grace-filled resolution. What evolved was that "reconciled diversity," often encouraged by Pope Francis and even envisioned in today's Revelation passage; and a wondrous experience of Jesus' promised Gospel gift: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

PARTICIPATE IN LITURGY

Bringing the Gifts to the Altar. You are most welcome and encouraged to present the gifts at Sunday Mass. Sign up at the Welcome Desk in the Narthex. A minimum of 4 and maximum of 8 people are needed to present the gifts; but single persons as well as families can sign up to join in the procession. Just arrive 10 minutes early on that day, check your name off in the book, and let one of the ushers know you are present. They will guide you as to the procedure.

<u>Mass Intentions read during the Prayers of the Faithful</u>. Mass intentions can be reserved at the Narthex desk, or by visiting or calling the Parish Office. At weekday Masses and at the 5 pm and 7:45 am Masses, only one intention is allowed (although names of related family members can count as one intention). At the 9:30 am and 11:15 am Masses, we can reserve more than one intention. We request a \$10 donation.

<u>Votive Candles</u> (on the east side of the sanctuary) may be reserved at the Narthex desk or at the parish office during the week. Candles last @ six days, and are changed on Saturday mornings. The donation is \$5.

SUMMER MISSION TRIP Take Stock In Our Teens!



In about a month, 32 teens and 14 adults from SMV are headed to Fremont, Nebraska to perform Mission Work. Our service will include: painting, yard work, indoor and outdoor clean-up, home repair, assisting children, and helping to distribute food to the needy.

Please support our Main Fundraiser for the Mission Trip by purchasing "stock" certificates after all Masses the weekends of June 1/2 and 8/9.

Common Stock Certificates are \$20 a share and Preferred Stock is \$100 each. As a stockholder, you will receive a postcard from a teen while on Mission and an invitation to a special Stockholders Meeting on August 8 complete with a dinner, and an update on the Mission Week.

PARISH PROJECTS UPDATE

Since we participated in the Archdiocesan **To Teach Who Christ Is** campaign back in 2014 we completed the major improvement projects which were specified in the case statement. You may remember we put in new air conditioning units for the Parish Center; we replaced the narthex floor; we installed the handicapped access doors on the east side of church; we put new siding and windows on the rectory and parish center. As specified, we subsidized our Youth Ministry Mission trips, Beloved Retreats and the purchase of handbells for the choir. All of this was accomplished through the generosity of our parishioners, using the funds we collected through the campaign. An unexpected bonus has occurred: after paying for all these projects we have a small balance left in our TTWCI account.

As you know, we have one major project on our calendar, to resurface the church and parish center parking lots, which we will fund with the donations to the **Paving Our Way** campaign we had last summer. The total cost for the parking lot and to install some additional drainage behind the Parish Center is estimated to cost \$239,611.80. We will use the balance from our To Teach Who Christ Is account (\$16,023.36) and \$223,588.44 from our Paving Our Way account to pay for this project. A contractor has been selected and we are waiting for approval from the Archdiocese. The project is scheduled to begin the week of July 8th. There may be some shuffling of cars for weekday masses, but that will be determined once the project starts.

Again, thank you for your generosity. We couldn't do all this without you!

COVE ALLIANCE—UPDATES AND THANK YOU FROM FR. HILARY (UGANDA)

"I used my first salary to put cement floor in my mother's house. Although the electricity grid goes right in front of our house, my mother did not have the capacity to tap electricity to light our house. So, tapping electricity for lighting our house was my priority number two. Recently I bought a refrigerator and started a small business for selling cold drinks in the town of Kapeeka. When I am at work, my mother takes care of the business, when I am home, I assist her. Now on top of the salary which I earn as a Midwife practitioner, we also earn a minimum of Ugx 150,000 as net profit from selling our cold drinks."

This is the partial story of Josephine Nansereko, Now a practicing Midwife working with St. Jerome COVE Health Center, in Kapeeka town, Uganda. Josephine was among the very first batch of children that COVE Alliance started supporting with education, clothing, health care and housing. At the time COVE Alliance started to support Josephine, she was six years and she had lost her father. Her mother could not support her through school and she (the mother) had other children (Josephine's siblings) who were not going to school and are now adults who never went to school. Josephine is now the hero of the family. Notice that Josephine is just one of the many who are now in this category because of you.

Although it is our vision, when COVE Alliance started in 2005, little did we know that our program would impact the lives of many children and enable them and their families to live with dignity! Since 2005 over 380 lives of Children have been directly touched by COVE, and of those, 27 have successfully completed their studies with at least a minimum of a college certificate and are now either employed in conventional employment sectors or self-employed. Currently COVE Alliance continues to provide education, health care and accommodation to 225 students in the following categories; 136 in pre-primary and primary schools, 77 in secondary schools, 12 in College/Tertiary schools. We are also operating a fullyfledged and licensed Private Board Primary School which can accommodate 250 children. This is where 98% of our sponsored Primary School children go. The school is equipped with enough classrooms, enough accommodation space, electricity and a backup generator, water source, a vehicle that helps in administration, and a very


good teaching and non-teaching staff. We are also running a Level II licensed Private Health Center which takes care of the health of the children, the staff and members of the outside community. It is also equipped with the basic medical equipment any health center of its caliber should have.

We are so grateful to Fr. Joe Curtis and the Parishioners of St. Mary of Vernon Catholic Church where COVE Alliance was born for giving an opportunity to the members of this Church (St. Mary of Vernon) and the surrounding communities to become missionaries to the children of Kapeeka, Kasana-Luweero Diocese and Uganda as a whole. Many of you have made mission trips to Uganda. many of you are sponsoring one or several children, many of you have been part of our volunteer team that organizes different fundraising events and many of you have supported COVE Alliance through attending and contributing heavily at those fundraising events, and many of you have made individual donations to COVE Alliance. We are so grateful! You are the very reason COVE Alliance exists. In a special way I would like to thank all of you who organized such a great event-the Seeds of Hope- that took place on April 29th, 2019. Our appreciation goes to all of you who attended and made donations towards it. May God bless you for your generosity.

We still have many children in Kapeeka and in the entire Diocese of Kasana-Luweero who need our support. We invite all those who would like to support a child in Africa to consider making this noble contribution through COVE Alliance. You may co-sponsor a child by making a half contribution of US \$ 480 for a child per year (\$ 40 per month) or take a full sponsorship by contributing \$960 for a child per year (\$ 80 per month). You may also make a general donation to COVE Alliance which will help COVE Alliance pay for the children's meals, medical care, clothing and staff salaries. MESS UP YOUR RESUME - PART 3

Not Customizing Your Resume

When you're applying to multiple jobs, it's tempting to use a generic, cookie-cutter resume and blast it out everywhere you're applying to. But that strategy may end up preventing your resume

from getting in a recruiter's hands at all. Many resumes are reviewed electronically before a human sees them, and if your resume doesn't have the keywords specified in the job description, it will likely be overlooked by the software.

How to avoid this trap: It may be a pain to create a customized resume for each company, but if you're truly interested in a position, it's worth it. Tailoring each submittal with keywords from the job posting is currently considered critical to pass the screening software used by many companies today.

The purpose of our Wellspring Employment Resource Community (WERC) ministry is to provide a safe and effective forum for sharing work search tools and techniques which can enable unemployed, underemployed, and job-searching parishioners in their efforts to find meaningful and rewarding work. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Why is it still Easter? The lilies have long since faded. The roots of our tradition of fifty days of rejoicing from Easter to Pentecost lie in the sevenday rhythm of the Jewish week, drawn from the six days of creation plus a Sabbath day. A favorite name for the Lord's Day among our ancestors in the faith was "The Eighth Day," meaning that in Christ a breakthrough to a new humanity was achieved. With that inner architecture, it makes sense to see Pentecost as a week of weeks, forty-nine days plus one, again signaling that a new age has begun in Christ and the outpouring of his Spirit. The Jewish appreciation for Pentecost gave rise to the Jubilee year, the fiftieth year, when debts were released and prisoners set free. Today, the character of our Easter Sundays is conveyed by joyful Alleluias and the rite of sprinkling at Mass. Long ago, people expressed this joy by suspending all rules of fasting and by never kneeling at liturgy.

These customs all point to our conviction that time is holy. There is an elegant balance to the Christian year: forty days of Lenten fast and discipline give way to fifty days of unrestrained rejoicing. That's why it is still Easter!




